LEADERSHIP COUNCIL SAN MATEO COUNTY Celebrates Its Inaugural Leadership CORPS Class

Burlingame, CA—On Saturday, June 4, 2022, LEADERSHIP COUNCIL SAN MATEO COUNTY graduated the Leadership CORPS Class of 2022.

This group of 38 accomplished individuals successfully completed the rigorous, 10-month experiential program designed to inspire, connect, and educate established leaders to positively transform San Mateo County. They represented all sectors—business, nonprofits, and government entities from across the county, and most importantly, the class demographics represented the diversity of the people who live and work in San Mateo County.

"When we started Leadership Council SMC with our Board of Directors and Advisory Council, our goal was to build upon our county's already collaborative culture while also working to bring voices to the table who were not being heard," said Kaarin Hardy, Leadership Council SMC Co-President, to the graduates.
