




AVG. IGA CAPITAL PER BENEFICIARIES OF 1ST CYCLE




MONTHLY HOUSEHOLD INCOME OF 1ST CYCLE WOMEN




AVG. HOUSEHOLD ASSET VALUE OF 1ST CYCLE BENEFICIARY






Impact on Incidence of Head Count Poverty

- Incidence of displacement or migration is lower for the beneficiary group

Key Success at a glance

- ► Successfully graduated 4464 beneficiaries in 1st cycle;
- ▶ Beneficiary income increased by 3.5 times at end-line in 1st cycle;
- Extreme poverty reduction of beneficiaries by 72% as against 19% in control group;
- Beneficiaries' school aged children school enrollments and attendance improve significantly;
- Multi-sector engagement creates very good enabling environment in the community for SWAPNO women;
- ► Formal sector employment created scope for inclusive economic development.







IGA Status of 2nd Cycle Beneficiaries







Most frequently operated IGAs
