History & Architecture

Aside from the palace, there is a vast array of architectural styles present within the city.

Sights & Sounds

Diocletian's Palace

A massive complex covering over 7 acres, Diocletian's Palace is an ancient fortress located in the center of Split. Constructed in the 4th century AD by the Roman Emperor Diocletian, it remains one of the most breathtaking Roman ruins in the world.




The Church of St. Francis is a Gothic-style monument that was constructed in the 14th century. The exterior of the church features a large rose window above the entrance and the interior features a vaulted ceiling and several works of art.



Located in the heart of Split's old town, Brace Radic Square is surrounded by a plethora of historical buildings including the Ethnographic Museum and the City Hall. It is also home to several restaurants and cafes making it a perfect spot to enjoy a meal or drink.



Established in 1910, the Ethnographic Museum is a museum dedicated to the cultural heritage of the Dalmatian region in Croatia and has amassed a collection of over 25,000 objects related to their traditional life and customs.



One of the most famous landmarks in the city of Split, this statue depicts the Croatian bishop. Gregory of Nin. An important figure in the history of the Dalmatian region, he is depicted raising his left hand in a gesture of blessing and holding a book in his right hand.



High-quality productions of opera, ballet and drama, let the sounds this theatre produces transport you to another world. The Croatian National Theatre was originally constructed in 1893 and showcases an impressive neoclassical design.



A beautiful and historic area located in the heart of Split, the old town is comprised of mazy streets and cultural landmarks and should be one of the first places you visit in this breathtaking city.



Dedicated to the life and works of famous Croatian artist, Ivan Mestrovic, the Mestrovic Gallery features a wide range of the artist's masterpieces and these include grand sculptures, stunning drawings and remarkable paintings.



A vibrant and lively waterfront promenade that offers stunning views of the Adriatic Sea, the Riva Promenade in Split is the ideal location to go for a leisurely walk or admire the boats and yachts that inhabit the harbor.

Old Town

The Old Town of Split is home to an array of historic buildings and is a maze of alleys, narrow streets and hidden courtyards. It is centered around the Diocletian's Palace, a UNESCO World Heritage Site that was constructed in the 4th century. The blend of ancient history and vibrant culture make the Old Town of Split a great place to visit for all travelers.

Veli Varoš

Poljud

Located here is the iconic Poljud Stadium which is home to the Hadjuk Split football team and was built in 1979 to host the Mediterranean Games. As well as football, Poljud is in close proximity to several other attractions such as Poljud Beach and Marjan Hill, which are popular spots for swimming and hill walking.

Znjan

Offering a peaceful and relaxing escape from the hustle and bustle of the city center, Znjan is home to a long and stunning pebble beach and several tranquil parks and green areas. Here, you can take part in a range of entertaining watersports or bask in the radiant Split sunlight. Znjan is Split at its most idyllic; serene and tranquil.



Stobreč

Just a few kilometers south of Split, Stobreč is a coastal town known for its beautiful beaches, crystal-clear water and endearing old town. 


