Year 9 HISTORY

Overall Intent:

Students in Year 9 will study the 20th Century, tackling concepts such as conflict, dictatorships and persecution/genocide. Students will further develop their understanding of historical skills including causation, significance, sources and historical interpretations. These will be revisited across Year 9 in order to prepare for GCSE level study at Year 10 by looking at a range of causes of conflicts, social and political challenges and military escalation. Students will be able to draw comparisons and links within history to better understand the expectations of life from 1066 to the present day.
