Year 7 MUSIC

Overall Intent:

In Year 7, students study rhythm and the other elements of music and learn how to manipulate these elements to create music. Students learn to read notation with confidence, layering up the complexity through different teaching methodology and gaining an understanding of the history and importance of music notation. They develop skills in how to improvise and compose individually and in groups using appropriate structures. Students learn how to perform with confidence, work within teams and respond to constructive feedback. These skills are built on in Year 8 when we will begin to study melody construction and the role of accompaniment by looking at a range of styles and genres, developing students' ability to respond, and to think and to be able to articulate their ideas through written and aural communication.
