

#### What is your connection to the CTWF?











Strategic Conversations and Aspirations:	Strategic conversation to deliver on the aspirations of tangata whenua.

#### Other comments

#### Strategic Leadership & Planning:

- Need for strong strategic leadership.
- Request for more workshops and strategic planning sessions.
- The need for a strategic plan that records iwi concerns/ideas and outlines how they will be addressed via Smartgrowth.
- Regular reporting on progress to avoid wasting resources.

#### Hapū-Based Development and Distinction:

- Emphasis on hapū-based developments and needs assessments.
- Emphasis on Hapu Authority in decision-making.
