### Item 5 – What’s New from the Tu Pakari Advisors (Paper C)

- Work undertaken by both Te Pio and Elva isn’t limited to forum meetings, also doing a lot of work behind the scenes – ensuring linkages with Councils, Takawaenga Units within Councils, works to increase projects – particularly housing & spatial planning work.
- Working with Māori Land Trust will consume a fair amount of Tu Pakari Advisors time.
- Collaboration extends to TCC, WBOPDC and BOPRC partners.
- Pou Hononga Engagement Specialist vacancy to work alongside Elva & Te Pio as engagement specialist as well as Iwi Spatial Plan, Māori Land Trust owners.

### Item 6 – Update on CTWF Priority Projects (Paper D)

- **Realising Māori Housing Aspirations**
  - First priority project is to realise Māori housing aspirations.
  - Work being undertaken with Pou Hono Māori Land Trusts (MLT), information will feed into the SmartGrowth Housing Action Plan (HAP).
  - Within HAP, from original survey Te Pio has summarised the status of 14 MLT’s. With the exception of two, all are zoned rural and account for 428 ha. 11 of the MLTs reside within TCC with remaining three within WBOPDC.
  - Based on initial assessments of initial projections and assuming infrastructure is provided to the MLTs by 2025, there is possibility of staging 214 houses across the blocks.
  - Tangible homes for whānau and tamariki are hoped for around 2025/26.
  - For MLTs starting out, Socialink has access to low interest funding to enable support to be provided.
- **Tangata Whenua Spatial Planning**
  - Ongoing work programme – work undertaken by Elva in recent months shared with the Forum.
  - First meeting held with Tangata Whenua Spatial Planning Group (TWSPG) - Whiti, Nathan, Des, Rawiri and Arthur to provide guidance on how to roll out spatial planning work over next 12 months.
  - Forum have confirmed number of outcomes as wanting to achieve as part of our work – Te Whenua, Te Ngākau, Te Taiao, Ngā Wāhi Tupuna, Te Manawaroa.
  - Elva to connect with Iwi & Hapū to determine what needs they have in regard to the Tangata Whenua Spatial Planning work.
  - National Policy Statement for Urban Development (NPS-UD) requirement to bring together statement of cultural values and aspiration for urban development. Elva to include this within the spatial planning project.
  - Feeling of spatial planning being a little behind with times, with global warming, and Covid which has changed the scene along with institutional changes at Central Government.
  - Feeling there needs to be a fund for sustainable initiatives on Māori Land.
  - Chris Nepia advised a lot of work happening in the spatial plan space within partner councils. Western Bay expressed desire to work alongside Elva in development of iwi spatial plan.

- Look to add further action when engaging with our people, working out what is required for the spatial planning programme as well as developing questions Council’s need in terms of their own projects and for Iwi – those who are wanting to review or develop their first Iwi / Hapū management plan.
- **Cultural Heritage Offsets – Des Heke**
  - Apologies from Des Heke.
  - This has been renamed Cultural Heritage Offsets Compensation.
- **Transport System Plan – Buddy Mikaere**
  - Apologies from Buddy Mikaere.

### Item 7 – Ways to build our collective capability

- Continue to look for ways to building collective capability.
  - **GIS Mapping & Analysis**
    - Interest from people to learn how to show information visually on a map. Option to include In-person training with GIS mapping
    - Potential opportunities for GIS licences.
  - **Spatial Planning**
    - This will occur over next 9 months naturally as engaging with people around this piece of work.
  - **Iwi & Hapu Management Plan**
    - How do we prepare a Iwi / Hapū management plan?
    - Look for informal training and/or holding of workshops.
  - **RMA**
    - How do we write effective submissions and resource consents?
  - **Understanding Local Government Act**
    - Work local councils undertaken as well as how funding is activated through long term plans.
  - **Project Management**
    - Scoping projects, writing project plan, assessing risk.

### Questions:

- **Where do we focus our capability efforts over the next 12 months?**
- **How - include in CTWF Meetings? Include in TCC/WBOPDC forum meetings? Hold in-person workshops? Hold online workshops?**
  - Iwi & Hapū management plan development – can we develop without relying on normal resources?

- Would like to see all as having opportunities to engage – collaboration within Councils with provisions of building capabilities across the collective occurs.
- GIS & Spatial Planning goes hand in hand – again requiring Council collaboration to support work by the Tu Pakari Advisors and the CTWF. How do we build the capability?

### **Item 8 – Ways to connect and engage effectively with our own**

- As speak to people about projects, make use of our own networks, reporting at Iwi/Hapū/Marae meetings.
- SmartGrowth CTWF web page – agendas, minutes, e-panui.
- Query around if these can be also uploaded to Marae Facebook / websites.
- Quarterly meetings – take these back to the Marae to enable the wider Iwi/Hapū to attend.
- The specific methods will vary depending on the project / kaupapa and respective Iwi/Hapū

### **Item 9 – Guest Presentation – Huriwai Paki – Ministry of Housing & Urban Development**

- Introduction to Oscar Damerham – Ministry of Housing & Urban Development in the Places & Partnerships Team. Role focused on Tauranga Moana and surrounding Western Bay of Plenty through SmartGrowth.
- Mainly around housing challenges the region is facing, involved in draft SmartGrowth Housing Action Plan, Kainga Ora on Ferncliff Farms, Tauriko, along with in general drafting of Joint Spatial Plan which is now underway, working alongside the Tangata Whenua Spatial Plan being developed by Elva & Te Pio.
- Also work with Māori Housing colleagues – Huriwai Paki is the Acting Manager of Te Kahui Kainga Ora, Māori Housing Policy Team at Ministry of Housing. Working on Policy around Māori housing funding.

Huriwai Paki joined the meeting and made a presentation to the Forum on funding mechanisms, what from Ministry of Housing & Urban Development, is available to support Whanau Māori housing aspirations from planning, investigation through to infrastructure and supply.

### **Item 10 – Other Business**

- Keren Pakeau – Team Leader, Te Pou Takawaenga, Tauranga City Council
  - Provided an update to changes within the Takawaenga Team.
  - Strategic Maori engagement within TCC, introduced new team members
    - Darlene Dinsdale – Three Waters engagement with Māori, some Māori land trusts and whanau will see her about. Two key roles are: assisting with engagement on Three waters and talking to MLT's on current and future water needs and issues as move into the Three Waters space.
    - Tane Brott – TCC Papakainga Advisor working with Māori land trusts around aspirations to build housing.
    - Currently advertising for Kai Arahi role within the organisation to assist with relationship management with Iwi / Hapū.
    - Cynthia Hamel looks after Iwi & Hapū on the Tauranga side, with Kayla Tukaki who looks after Iwi / Hapū on Ngati Ranginui side, Mount, Matapihi and Papamoa, with Keren looking after Papamoa through to Papamoa East.

### - Chris Nepia

- Capacity being built around respective Takawaenga and Kaupapa Māori teams, reflection of mahi being undertaken.
- Moved the Māori Land Rates function from Rates team to Kaupapa Māori team due to issues of use and development of whenua Māori beyond rates that needed to be dealt with from a Kaupapa Māori perspective rather than from a Finance perspective.
- Also looking at piece of Mahi which is being undertaken by Tane – support around work we do to assist Whanau with Papakainga aspirations.

- Very deliberate campaign – Generation Change – which is “very in your face”, diversity required at Elected Member table, deliberate need for Māori to be around the table, not only in Māori Ward capacity, also in General wards.
- Housing – Councils typically think the role they have is zoning land and opening up greenfield land for development along with small portfolio of elder housing – recognised that biggest crisis beyond climate change affecting community, in particular whanau & Hapū is housing. Lack of it, quality and so Elected Members have made decision to take a more direct role in housing, recognising not just about opening up new land for houses that will be \$1.6- \$1.8M by time hit market, that a broader look is required including Papakainga. Where are our emergency and transitional homes – Te Puke? Katikati? Assisted rentals? Affordable homes to buy. Also consider how can we co-fund this.

### REALISE MĀORI HOUSING ASPIRATIONS

Work has included, but is not limited to:

- Establishment of Ara Rau Tāngata (Māori Land Trust forum) underway.
- Engagement planning underway – looking at an area-specific and marae-clustered hui and workshops (see overleaf).
- Regular meetings with Housing Action Plan (HAP) working group and Priority Development Area (PDA) Task Group.

Tāngata whenua engagement has been limited due to resourcing constraints (refer TWSP update).

### Cultural Heritage Offsets Research

Been collating examples of cultural offsets in current practice in consents, now we have it in draft planning policy.

Working more with Te Arawa reps (following work with Nassah’s team) in the experience and understanding with net loss of cultural heritage and traditions i.e. pā sites and mahinga kai activities.

### Transport System Plan

### SPATIAL PLANNING

*Status: In progress*

Tāngata whenua engagement has been limited due to resourcing constraints. No applications received for the Pou Hononga role. Have since gained a secondment from WBOPDC and working on short-term contracts for specific skillsets. Other initiatives outlined overleaf.

Spatial planning content development underway from existing sources of information and a framework has been developed identifying key focus areas

Implementation of capability building plan will commence in the coming weeks (e.g., training workshops).

Ongoing work to secure funding to implement spatial plan work, capacity building work and support tāngata whenua aspirations .

Input to Joint Spatial Plan (JSP) working group. The group are meeting monthly.

Focus for the coming two months is small scale engagement (e.g., iwi authority, marae committee), online survey and then leading up to larger scale wānanga later in the year.

## CTWF Enabling Actions – Update Aug 2022

### **Build our collective capability and capacity**

To ensure we are building long term capacity and capability to be involved effectively in regional planning.

Capability and training priority areas for the coming 12 months:

1. Iwi and hapū management planning, review and/or development
2. Iwi, hapū spatial mapping and planning
3. Project planning and project management and project implementation
4. Cultural monitoring

### **Effective communication and engagement with hapū, iwi, marae committees and Māori Land entities**

- No applications received for the Pou Hononga role. Tū Pakari advisors – who have limited capacity – are pursuing options to progress engagement in the absence of a dedicated resource. This includes:
  - Combining engagement for Māori housing and tāngata whenua spatial planning, where appropriate. This includes a range of -on-1 hui; marae or hapū-specific workshops as well as area-specific wānanga.
  - Alternative resourcing arrangements including a secondment from WBOPDC and short-term contracts for specific skillsets.
  - Taking a phased approach to engagement and delivery of outputs. For example, focusing on two of the five CTWF outcomes (Appendix 1 – Te Whenua, Te Ngākau) over the next year.
  - Utilising the Tū Pakari “He Pitopito Kōrero” e-pānui / newsletter to improve communication from CTWF members to their hapū/iwi.
- Establishment of Ara Rau Tāngata (Māori Land Trust forum) is underway.
- Work underway to collate the contact details for marae committees and Māori Land entities.

### **Support from SmartGrowth partner agencies**

- Te Kahui Kaunihera (comprising Tu Pakari advisors and Council Takawaenga teams) still meeting regularly. This is to ensure alignment across our work.
- Regular meetings with SmartGrowth partner teams to discuss project linkages (e.g., spatial planning within Tauranga City Council; Joint Spatial Plan; Te Arawa Housing Strategy) and opportunities for funding.
- Regular meetings with Nichola Lennard and Annika Lane from JSP to ensure alignment of timeframes for TWSP content development.
- Resourcing (in the form of a secondment) from the Western Bay of Plenty District Council planning team to provide assistance with the TWSP input.

# Tāngata Whenua Spatial Plan – Aug 2022

## WORKSTREAM 1. WHAKAPIRINGA TĀNGATA | ENGAGEMENT

### Completed and/or underway

- Presentation to Te Ihu o Te Waka o Te Arawa on 20 July.
- Hui have been held with some Iwi and hapū regarding available information to input into spatial planning; capability building needs and preferred method(s) of engagement for spatial planning.
- No applications received for the Pou Hononga role. We have since secured a secondment from WBOPDC to help support TWSP. Identified/engaged with additional contractors, in particular support to facilitate sub-regional workshops for November.
- Continuing to link with Māori Housing hui/workshops led by Pou Ārahi. Likewise for ensuring linkages with projects led by SmartGrowth partner agencies.
- Engagement for Māori housing and spatial planning will be combined, where appropriate.

### Upcoming Tangata Whenua specific engagement:

- August – December engagement (subject to capacity): 1-on-1 hui, iwi authority, marae or hapū-specific workshops.
- November sub-regional workshops (east, west, central and Matakana), for spatial planning and Māori housing.
- September, subject to funding, launch online tools and tangata whenua online surveys to complement in-person engagement.

## WORKSTREAM 2. WHAKAKOHIKOHI KORERO | FEEDBACK ANALYSIS AND CONTENT DEVELOPMENT

### Completed

- Framework developed to identify key Tangata Whenua focus areas that forms spatial planning content, (this work expands on the TWF key outcomes for Tangata Whenua, aligning content to NPS UD requirements, current Joint Spatial Plan content).

### Underway

- Collation of tāngata whenua values, aspirations, and geospatial information, from within existing publicly available documents (i.e CTWF reports; Iwi/hapū management plans; treaty settlement documents, SmartGrowth reports, UFTI report) as well as Council geospatial and open data sources. In addition, moulding of collated information into preliminary objectives/aspirations, context and actions.
- Supporting Iwi/hapū in doing their own spatial planning (incl aligning engagement opportunities and advocating for funding).

### Upcoming

- Gather and analyse feedback from engagement.
- Ongoing work with JSP team to guide and input to spatial plan development.

### WORKSTREAM 3. POIPOIA NGA TĀNGATA | CAPABILITY BUILDING

#### Completed

- Capability plan which captures feedback from June CTWF meeting - members are keen for a focus on Iwi Management Plan training, specifically reviewing and writing effective plans, which in turn will better inform SmartGrowth Projects and engagement. Where possible, spatial planning as well as project management will be weaved into the training.

#### Underway

- Implementation planning and exploring potential opportunities for support and funding.
- There has been interest by some CTWF members to build their own GIS mapping capability. We are also working with BOPRC staff to coordinate in-person GIS training and potential GIS licences. This will complement the access to free fortnightly training workshops run by Land Information New Zealand (Nga Poutama Matawhenua).
