


Figure S 1. Self-reported ethnic and cultural connection at age 12Y for Māori (total response).




Figure S 2. Self-reported ethnic and cultural connection at age 12Y for Pacific (total response).




Figure S 3. Self-reported ethnic and cultural connection at age 12Y for Asian (total response).




Figure S 4. Self-reported ethnic and cultural connection at age 12Y for Middle Eastern/Latin American/African (MELAA) (total response).




Figure S 5. Self-reported ethnic and cultural connection at age 12Y for Other ethnicities (total response).




Figure S 6. Self-reported ethnic and cultural connection at age 12Y for sole European.




Figure S 7. Multipolar gender identity and expression for Male in the Sex categorisation.




Figure S 8. Multipolar gender identity and expression for Female in the Sex categorisation.




Figure S 9. Multipolar gender identity and expression for Boy/Mostly boy in the Gender categorisation.




Figure S 10. Multipolar gender identity and expression for Girl/Mostly girl in the Gender categorisation.




Figure S 11. Multipolar gender identity and expression for Non-binary/Unsure participants in the Gender categorisation.




Figure S 12. Multipolar gender identity and expression for Cisgender Boys in the Trans-Non-binary/ Cisgender categorisation.




Figure S 13. Multipolar gender identity and expression for Transgender Boys in the Trans-Non-binary/Cisgender categorisation.




Figure S 14. Multipolar gender identity and expression for Cisgender Girls in the Trans-Non-binary/ Cisgender categorisation.




Figure S 15. Multipolar gender identity and expression for Transgender Girls in the Trans-Non-binary/Cisgender categorisation.




Figure S 16. Multipolar gender identity and expression for Non-binary/Unsure participants in the Trans-Non-binary/ Cisgender categorisation.
