KS1	Pupils should be taught:		
	As part of investigating the beliefs and practices of religions and other world views, pupils should be taught to:		
	• Recall and name different beliefs and practices, including prayer, worship, festivals, rituals and ways of life, in order to find out about the meanings behind them; • Retell and suggest meanings for some religious and moral stories, exploring and discussing sacred writings and sources of wisdom and recognising the traditions from which they come; • Recognise some ways that people express beliefs and belonging through prayer, worship, symbols and actions, appreciating some similarities between communities.		
KS2	Pupils should be taught: As part of investigating the beliefs and practices of religions and other world views, pupils should be taught to: • Describe and understand links between stories and other aspects of the communities they are investigating, responding thoughtfully to beliefs and teachings that arise from them; • Describe and make connections between different features of the religions and other world views, discovering more about prayer, celebrations, worship, pilg rimages and the rituals which mark important points in life.
