





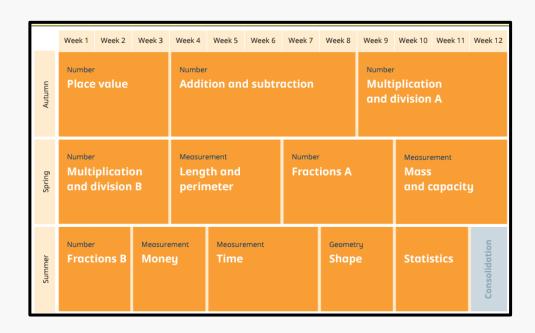

recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter observe how magnets attract or repel each other and attract some materials and not others

compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of whether they are attracted to a magnet, and identify same magnetic materials

describe magnets as having 2 pales

predict whether 2 magnets will attract or repel each other, depending on which poles are facing

explore the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants, including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal
