## APPENDIX -- EXHIBIT A

### ***COVID-19 Task force Recommendation to GSB on returning to 100% DL Feb 23, 2021***

Wai'alaie School's COVID-19 Task Force recommends that School Leadership shift the educational model back to 100% Distance Learning for All Students if/when one of the following scenarios exist:

- The 7-day Case Count Average per 100,000 population is at or exceeds 15.5 cases for at least 7 days
- The Percent Positivity Rate is at or exceeds 7.5% for at least 7 days
- Statewide or City/County lockdown order is issued

#### **Monitoring, Communication, and Mitigation:**

The Task Force will monitor the 7-day Case Count Average per 100,000 population and the Percent Positivity Rate.

- School Leadership will notify families of increased cases and remind them of our decision making metrics if/when one of the following scenarios exist:
  - The 7-day Case Count Average per 100,000 population is on an upward trend and reaches 9.0
  - The 7-day average of Percent Positivity Rate is on an upward trend and reaches 4.2%
- The school may implement additional mitigation measures (e.g. wearing face shields and masks) if/when one of the following scenarios exists:
  - The 7-day Case Count Average per 100,000 population is on an upward trend and reaches 10.4%
  - The Percent Positivity Rate is on an upward trend and reaches 5.0%

The following will be considered to determine whether additional mitigation strategies or school closure are needed to protect the school community:

- Number of cases and whether they are close together in time or spread out over several weeks
- Whether new cases are traceable to the school community or whether they likely from a different exposure (e.g., household exposure, travel)
- Where are the cases occurring and if they have any common themes (e.g., confined to one group within the school or clustered in 1 or 2 zip codes)
- Number of close contacts each case has
- Whether there is significant COVID-19 transmission in the surrounding community that will likely impact families and staff
