OPENING LETTER



This has been a particularly remarkable year for the Big Sky Community and Yellowstone Club Community Foundation (YCCF). The Foundation continues to have a significant impact in education, arts, healthcare, conservation, and community services in the greater Big Sky and Gallatin Valley area through their grant making.

In 2019, the first ever workforce housing project in Big Sky was successfully completed. YCCF seed funded the Down Payment Assistance Program which was integral to the success of this project. Through a community wide fundraising effort lead by Big Sky Community Organization, Big Sky will now have a new community center, BASE, in 2021. Thanks to the

generosity of donors like you, YCCF's Big Sky Community Center Fund raised \$6.5 million. The Foundation also strengthened their commitment to mental and behavioral health services offered in Big Sky through a grant to Bozeman Health Foundation.

Donors continued their generous support for annual giving and participated in our three fundraising events: the 10th annual Tom Weiskopf Cup golf tournament, our spring Wine & Song evening featuring Marc Cohn, and the New Year's Eve Name That Run auction.

Change is happening fast in this corner of Montana. As contributions have grown, so have partnerships with local nonprofits. Together, we are making a difference.


