## B (Badajoz) Company 1 FUSILIERS 1992 - 93

May 2023 marks the 30th anniversary of the

disbanding of B (Badajoz)
Company of 1 FUSILIERS

# following their return from a unique operational tour in

Northern Ireland. The Company was raised in August 1992 following the merger of 1 and 3 FUSILIERS specifically to meet the requirements of an emergency tour in County Fermanagh under command of the 1st Battalion Irish Guards (1 IG). The Company initially formed up in Warminster in August 1992 where 1 FUSILIERS was the Combined Arms Training Centre Battle Group before moving to Pirbright in September and deploying to N Ireland on 1 November.

Under the Defence Review 'Options for Change' in 1991 following the end of the Cold War, the Tory government imposed heavy cuts on the military budget and specifically on Infantry battalions. It was decided by the powers that be that the FUSILIERS would lose a Regular battalion and 1 and 3 FUSILIERS would merge. The Irish Guards had not been on the Op BANNER roster due to its obvious connections with both northern and southern Ireland. However, 1 IG was now about to embark on its first tour of N Ireland and needed to be backfilled urgently. 1 FUSILIERS with a surplus of manpower from its merger had the capacity to provide and duly did so.

In general the Company was made up with Fusiliers and JNCOs from 1

FUSILIERS, and SNCOs from 3
FUSILIERS. Major James Sayer was
OC, Captain Guy Briseldon 2IC and
WO2 Mark Mooney CSM. The 3
FUSILIERS members were highly
experienced having just returned from
the Gulf War and many of the 1
FUSILIERS members were newly
joined and were about to undertake
their first operational tour. Despite not
knowing each other it was a great
reflection on the Fusilier family that
the unit gelled very quickly and
happily.

As to the tour itself, it was a busy time with the Company being augmented with a Troop of RHG/D and an IG platoon and given the whole of the border from Lisnaskea to Belleek to cover. Mainly operating out of Permanent Vehicle Check Points (PVCPs) and RUC stations, the tour got off to a tragic start with the murder of RUC Constable Corbett at Belcoo by a sniper, in which Fusilier Donathy was later awarded a MiD. Later in the tour, the PVCP at Mullen Bridge was attacked by mortar fire fortunately without casualties; this saw the first ever cross-border air to ground return of fire by an Army Lynx helicopter which was carrying the QRF in response. In the follow up operation led by the late Lt Matt Thorpe, the author and the Brigade Commander were landed by helicopter in the Republic erroneously by a few



yards (in the days before GPS!) and had to hot foot it back to N Ireland.

1992/93 was a busy time for the Regiment in N. Ireland especially with 2 FUSILIERS operating out of Ballykinler at the same time. B (Badajoz) company was a unique unit and it is no surprise that many of the Fusiliers and NCOs went on to have excellent careers in the Regiment and the wider Army.

# The Centenary of the 17th Royal Fusiliers Memorial, Warlingham

n Thu 20 April, Fusiliers joined members of the community to mark the Centenary of the

dedication of the 17th Royal Fusiliers War Memorial at All Saints Church in Warlingham.

The 17th Battalion RF were billeted in this small Surrey village, during their preparation to fight in WW1. A very strong friendship between the Battalion and Warlingham was created.



The King's Colour was laid up in the Church and the Battle Honours sewed on by local women, including Kate Fox, the then Duchess of Kent's former nanny and friend. The last CO of the Bn was a certain Lt Col BL Montgomery.

The Fusiliers were represented by serving members of 5 FUSILIERS as well as Fusilier Cadets from Balham and a number of Fusilier Association members.

# Regimental Medal and Certificate of Merit to Peter Galloway

The Regimental Medal and
Certificate of Merit was
awarded to Peter Galloway on Sat
22 April at the 1RF/RRF Branch
Dinner held at HM Tower of London.
The medal was presented by Brigadier
J Lamb MC, Colonel London.

Peter Galloway was born in 1933. In 1951 he enlisted as a Regular soldier in the Royal Fusiliers. After recruit training he was posted to the 1st Battalion in Germany. In 1952 the Battalion was sent to fight in Korea and Peter went as a member of the Mortar Platoon. In February 1954, on return to the United Kingdom, he volunteered to serve with the Parachute Regiment and was selected. His engagement ended on 1 July 1956. Four days later he was recalled from reserve service at the beginning of the Suez crisis. He made an operational jump at Suez in the short campaign later that year, before ending his Army engagement on 1 January 1957.

Peter's wife, Myrtle, died in 2016. This was an extremely difficult period for him but he continued to support the Fusilier Association throughout.

Peter has been a keen member of the 1 RF/RRF Branch of the Fusiliers Association since its formation in 1968, and became a Standard Bearer for the Branch in the mid 1990s, an





appointment he fulfils to this day. He is tireless in his charitable collections and can be seen regularly supporting the Taxi Charity for Military Veterans.

Aged just under 90, Peter still responds to requests for a Regimental Standard Bearer in London and the Home Counties. Thus, he parades in this capacity on Remembrance Sunday, at other Association events and at funerals. His service to the Fusilier Association over the past thirty years or so has been

outstanding. The Regimental Council has therefore awarded Peter a

Regimental Medal and Certificate of Merit.

## 60 Years since the Royal Warwicks joined the Fusiliers

May 2023 is the 60th anniversary of the start of The Royal Warwickshire Regiment's journey to become Fusiliers. On 1 May 1963, the 1st Battalion

paraded at Gordon Barracks in Hameln,
West Germany, to receive their new Fusilier
cap badges and hackles in blue and orange
(best known as "royal blue over old gold,
with a touch of Dutch pink"). From that date
onward, they were called The Royal
Warwickshire Fusiliers joining the other
three Fusilier Regiments to form the Fusilier
Brigade whose headquarters and training
depot were at St George's Barracks in
Sutton Coldfield in what was then
Warwickshire. Almost five years later, the
Brigade became The Royal Regiment of


