## ETIQUETTE OF THE GAME OF GOLF

In the interest of all, know the rules and observe the Etiquette of the game of Golf, it's not only a tribute to you but also to the club.

Players should play without delay, ensure that you keep up with the group in front at a reasonable pace. Responsibility of the lowest marker to monitor the speed of play. If a group fails to keep its place on the course and loses more than one clear hole on the players in front, it should allow the match following to pass.

Mark your scorecard on the next tee. Remember, players behind you also wish to fulfil their round. Slow play is selfish and affects all players.

No player shall move, talk, or stand close to or directly behind the ball or the hole when a player is addressing the ball or making a stroke.
A player who has incurred a penalty should intimate the fact to his / her opponent or marker as soon as possible.

In the absence of Special Rules, two-ball matches should have precedence over and be entitled to pass any three or four-ball match.

## ETIQUETTE BEFORE YOUR GAME OF GOLF

Tee Times: Members should be available to collect their cards 15 minutes before the booked tee time.

Booking Sheet: Members wishing to cancel a booked time must notify the Golf Shop staff at least 24 hours prior to the booking.

Before Play: Members should read any notices regarding local rules or notices relating to the play of competition. Members should check their scorecards to check for any temporary local rules.

Score Cards: The rules of golf place the onus on the competitor to see that his correct score is recorded by his marker for each hole. The score must be recorded by his marker at the completion of each hole. The practice of writing up cards in the clubhouse is not permitted. The competitor must (1) ensure that the marker has signed the card; (2) countersign the card himself; (3) record score in slice terminals upstairs in club house; (4) place the card in the competition box in the Clubhouse. Any alteration on the card must be initialed by the marker.

Mobile Phones: Mobile phones allowable with discretion, constant use is frowned upon.

## LOST GOLF BALL ETIQUITTE

NOTE: The Rules of Golf (18.2a (1)) stipulate that you are only allowed 3 minutes (180 seconds) to search for a lost golf ball.
Players searching for a ball should signal the player/s behind them to pass as soon as it becomes apparent the ball will not easily be found. They should not continue to play until the players following them have passed and are out of range.

## ALL PLAYERS NEED TO ADOPT A READY GOLF ATTITUDE

Below are some ready golf recommendations for all players to consider while playing a round at Leonay Golf Course.

## On Par 4 or Par 5 Holes

- If the group in front are in range of longer hitters, allow shorter hitters to play first from the tee or fairway if longer hitters are waiting to hit first regardless of who has the honour (let them know you are going to!). No player should play until the group in front is out of range.
NOTE: This is not applicable when playing Matchplay format.
- When chipping or putting, play your shot if the player furthest away is not ready.
- Putt out if you do not interfere with another player's line.
- Hit your shot before helping to look for a lost ball.
- Move buggies and carts away from the front of the green before putting out.
- Leave the putting green immediately after all the players have putted out.


## Calling Up On Par 3's

- Playing golf involves inherent risks, including risk of being struck by a golf ball. The risk of being struck significantly increases when players "call up" the following group on a par 3 hole. Calling up on a par 3 hole is not encouraged. Any player calling up a following group does so at the players own risk.


## COURSE CARE <br> COURSE RULES THE COURSE STAFF HAVE RIGHT OF WAY AT ALL TIMES

Members and visitors are requested to assist the course staff in the proper maintenance of the course by:

- Carrying and using the sand buckets provided
- Using bins provided for disposal of rubbish.
- Keep Golf Carts at least 15 metres away from the greens.
- After having played out of a bunker, a player should carefully repair all marks made therein. Rake Bunker inward and place rake in the center of the bunker.


## REPAIRING BALL MARKS



1. Always start at the back of the mark and push forward with the repairer.
2. Use repairer around all sides and slowly ease turf toward the centre of the mark. Do not lift the soil upwards.
3. Lightly tap down with your putter.
4. Your completed repairs should look like the images above.

## REPAIRING DIVOTS



- A player should ensure all divots are replaced or filled with sand and any damage on the putting surface is repaired.


## HOUSE RULES

Members are expected to take pride in their Club regarding dress and conduct generally and to assist in the observance of the by-laws of the Emu Plains Sporting and Recreation Club.

All Members and Visitors handicaps to be 36 maximum.

## RULES OF DRESS ON THE COURSE

- Satisfactory footwear must be worn. Ripple sole shoes, thongs, sandals, and high heels shoes are not permitted under any circumstances.
- Shorts with short sports socks are permitted.


## COMPLAINTS / PROTESTS

All complaints must be made in writing to the Secretary of the Golf Club who will submit them to the meeting of the Golf Club Committee.
All protests or disputes in connection with a competition or match shall be submitted in writing within 15 minutes of the completion of the round to the Captain, Secretary, or other member of the Golf Committee.

## RIGHT OF THE COURSE

The President and Captain shall have the right of the course at any time should they desire to exercise.

## MATCH COMMITTEE

The Match Committee reserves the right to alter the programme, Grades and other conditions of play or competition rules at any time prior to, or during competition if those alterations do not interfere or conflict with the Rules of Golf.

NOTE: When playing Ambrose events, 3 tee shots records must be marked on the scorecard, failure to do will result in disqualification.

## HOW TO PLAY THE FOLLOWING FORMATS

## STROKE EVENTS INCLUDING MEDAL ROUNDS

The score of each hole is recorded on the Scorecard provided. At the end of play this is calculated with the player's handicap deducted.
Almost all Members' competitions are open events. However, visitors, including honorary members from reciprocal clubs, cannot win a Championship or a Medal. If a visitor wins a Medal Round he will be awarded with the appropriate prize, but the medal itself will be awarded to the most successful member according to the rules for this competition.

## STABLEFORD

The method of playing Stableford competition is for the player to take strokes at holes as indicated on the Scorecard and to score points on the nett results at each hole. At the end of the round all points are added up and the player having the highest number of points is the winner in their respective Grades.

## ALTERNATIVE STABLEFORD FORMATS - AMERICAN SINGLE STABLEFORD

Played like a normal Stableford game but with no handicap. The player's handicap is added at the end of their round with the points acuminated during the round. Once a player has reached a stroke, scored worse than a double bogey (2 over par) and has not holed out, the player is to pick up and proceed to the next hole without delay.

## IRISH SINGLE STABLEFORD

Played like a normal Stableford game, points are multiplied and added to the Scorecard as follows.

- Holes 1-6 = 1x Multiplied
- Holes 7-12 $=2 \times$ Multiplied
- Holes 13-18 = 3x Multiplied

NOTE: If a player is unsure how to score the alternative stableford formats above, a player is to record their stroke score without holding up play. The scores will be processed by the computer in the Proshop.

## HOW TO PLAY TEAM BASED FORMATS <br> CANADIAN FOURSOMES

Both players play tee shots at every hole and afterwards continue with whichever ball they nominate with the partner playing the second stroke.

## AMERICAN FOURSOMES

Both players play tee shots at each hole, then play a second stroke with their partner's ball. One ball is then selected and play proceeds as in Foursomes with the OWNER of the ball selected playing the third shot.

NOTE: If one player incurs a penalty stroke, this does not alter the rotation of play. In Foursome stroke competition held over several rounds, the order of play maybe changed between rounds unless the Committee has laid down a condition of play, that the original order of play must be preserved or changed through the competition. Foursomes can be played under either stroke play rules or Matchplay conditions and Rule 22 is relevant to Foursomes.

## IRISH STABLEFORD

Playing as a team of four, all players play out each hole as they would in individual stableford. On the first six holes, only the best stableford score of the four players is recorded. On the next six holes (holes 7-12 inclusive) only the best two stableford scores are recorded. On the next six holes (holes 13-18 inclusive), only the best three stableford scores are recorded.

## CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Entrant must be a financial member of Emu Plains Sporting and Recreation Club Ltd. in the following categories:

- Full Male / Lady Membership
- Senior Male / Lady Membership
- Intermediate Membership
- Junior Membership
- Entry Fees must be paid in full prior to the commencement of the first round of the Championship event.

To be eligible to participate in any Club Championship event a member must hold a valid Golf Australia handicap, with no less than 10 individual cards submitted in the 12 months prior to the $1^{\text {st }}$ round and be a financial member for 3 months prior to the start of the Championships.

NOTE: Application can be made to the Match Committee prior to the Championship if extraordinary circumstances prevent a member complying. Members must remain financial members of the club for the duration of the Championship, including any Match Play events. Members are only eligible to play in one grade of Championships in a calendar year.

The top eight (8) qualifiers in A, B and C Grades will play in a seeded draw in the final round of the Club Championships, at a time specified by the Match Committee. Failure to adhere to this condition will result in the member being ineligible to win a championship and will be excluded from the Match Play Championship, with only extraordinary exceptions considered.

Championships include - both Scratch and Nett Results:

- Men's Club Championship (Open to Leonay 7-day Male Members Only)
- Men’s Foursomes Championship (Open to Leonay 7-day Male Members Only)

## TIES

In the event of two or more players returning equal scores in a competition, the winner shall be decided as follows:
Championships - Play-off over 3 holes (holes 1,2 \& 18) with best aggregate score over the 3 holes. If not decided after the 3 play-off holes, move to sudden death using the same 3 holes.
All other ties in Championships, including runner up and match play positions will be determined by count back taking the last 18 -hole score recorded. If still tied, position/s will be determined by count back as set out under 'count back' in the program book. Autumn Cup decided on a count back. (No play-off)
Leonay Open \& Ray Dukes: Sudden death play-off holes 1,2 \& 18 until a result.

1. Monthly Medals, including Medal of Medals, will be decided on a count back. (No playoffs, refer to 'count back' system.
2. All other events to be decided on a 'count back' (see next page)

## COUNT BACK SYSTEM

The following procedure will be adopted when deciding results by count back.

1. Last nine holes stroke score total on score card,
2. Last six holes strokes score on score card,
3. Last three holes stroke score on score card, then
4. Hole by hole until results decided, commencing from $18^{\text {th }}$ hole on score card.

## STARTING TIMES

Members are requested to report to the starter 15 minutes before their hit-off time; otherwise, they may lose their place and may be sent to the end of the field or may incur a penalty (suspension or disqualification) as the Match Committee may decide.

Saturday starting times as programmed on the Starting Sheet. Members are responsible for their own entries on the Starting Sheet - no exceptions given.

The times placed on the Starters Sheet by members will be accepted and adopted by the Match Committee as the official starting times i.e., THE TIME LAID DOWN BY THE MATCH COMMITTEE.

## THE EMU SPORTS CLUB CUPP

The Emu Sports Club Cupp is an annual competition starting in August and finishing in July the following year.
Every Monthly Medal round, the top twenty net scores from each grade receive points (table is on golf website) and these points are accumulated throughout the year until the final round, which is the July Medal. ESCC is open to all 7-day golfing members The competition is sponsored by the Emu Plains Sporting Club, and the person with the most points receives their annual membership for free.

## LAST MEMBER STANDING - LMS

Open to all 7-day members only.
From February to September each year all registered players stableford scores from Thursday and Saturday competition rounds go towards Last Member Standing qualification.
Registration is through the Pro Shop or the Men's Golf Committee
Entry Fee \$30.00.
Qualification Starts from Thursday $1^{\text {st }}$ February 2024.
Qualification Finishes on Saturday $28^{\text {th }}$ September 2024.
Final Sunday $10^{\text {th }}$ November 2024 9am
Lady Golfers are welcome to qualify and compete.
Qualifying scores from Saturday and Thursday Competitions Only.

NOTE: Last Man Standing is a type of Match Play event, practice will be allowed on the Course on the day.

## VETERAN POINTS SCORE CHALLENGE

Veteran Points Score Challenge is annual stableford event played on a Monday over five rounds from October to November with the best 3 scores counted.

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Entrant must be a financial member of Emu Plains Sporting and Recreation Club Ltd. in the following categories:

- Full Male / Lady Membership OR
- Senior Male / Lady Membership

Note: Must be a financial member for 3 months prior to the start of the Veteran Points Score Challenge.
