Their varied programme includes foxtrots, tangos, mazurkas and polkas, in addition to waltzes.

CONCERT (5) 04 February 2022



Returning artist, Daniel won 1st Prize at the Young Concert Artists auditions in Paris & New York. A year later he recorded music by Bartók for Decca and in 2016 won the most promising Pianist prize at the Sydney International Competition. Born in Hungary, Daniel studied at the Franz Liszt Academy with István Gulyás and Gyöngyi Keveházi and at the Royal Academy of Music with Pascal Nemirovski. He is a Young Classical Artists Trust (YCAT) featured artist.
