



Marty's first interaction with the Papanui Club was in the late 80's as a barman whilst studying accounting at Christchurch University, he was a keen dart player and enjoyed the social aspect of the Club.

In the late 90's the Club hit troubled times and the then President Ian Kelly sought the assistance of Marty to help steer the Club back from the issues that had arisen. He was voted on to the committee in 1997 and was immediately appointed Chair of finance.

He was instrumental in developing new procedures to ensure accountability and transparency, many of which are still being utilised today.

In 2003 Marty was awarded life membership for the services he provided over that period.

Marty continued to serve on the committee in various roles, including executive member & Chair of finance, Vice President, and President in 2016.

Marty's contribution to the Papanui Club being at the forefront of the Club Industry cannot be understated. From championing the inclusion of a Gym facility, to heading the Rebuild Committee following the 2011 earthquakes and providing the Club with arguably the Best Club to ever have been built, and changing the face of modern Club life.

Nobody can argue Marty's love, passion and drive to ensure the Club reached it's potential in delivering great outcomes for members and the wider community of Papanui.
