2024 got off to a great start with strong attendance by members in all areas of the club over the summer months. It has also been a period of change and members will see the impact of these changes as we move forward. 2024 will continue to bring about change as well as opportunity, as the board focuses on improving member facilities and service while at the same time ensuring robust financial and compliance management. Some of the highlights in the last quarter have included:




Garden Club


Technology Section
