

Rules and Regulations

- All overnight vehicles must register with the front office to receive a parking tag. Cars on premises overnight without a parking tag will be towed.
- Quiet hours from 10PM to 8AM. Please be respectful of other guests.
- Check out is 10AM for Cabins and Yurts, 12PM for RV and Tent sites, Late checkout may be requested for an additional charge, subject to availability.
- Pets must be leashed at all times.
- Please clean up after your pets using one of the stations throughout the property.
- ** Do not leave pet unattended or tethered. Any damage to the property by pets will be charged to the guest.
- No fireworks, fire arms, or illegal substances allowed on the premises.
- ** Please be conscious of bears in the area. All food must be stored safely inside vehicle or cabin. No food stored inside tents or yurts. Food and trash left outside overnight will incur a fee.
- ** Keep a safe fire. Don't burn logs larger than fire ring. No burning of trash, plastic, or glass. Ensure fires are extinguished before leaving for the day
- We ask that parents hold their children to high standards of behavior and respect for other guests including keeping noise down during quiet hours and at the pool so others can enjoy the park and its beauty.
- Our staff will pick up trash from 8AM-10AM daily. Please leave your trash at the end of your site or along the golf cart path behind your cabin/yurt.
- → Please use EV station to charge electric vehicles, not RV pedestals.
- Help us conserve water and relieve pressure on our utility infrastructure. Limit water usage during showers and hand washing, and only flush septic safe materials.
- Please do not stack rocks in the streams, as this disrupts wildlife.
- ** No smoking is allowed in cabins, yurts, Lodge, or communal areas. If your unit smells of smoke upon your departure, you will be assessed a fine of \$350 to cover the additional cleaning

Maddron Bald-

It doesn't get much better than a trail right out our back door! This is a 6.6 mile, moderate difficulty trail leading to Maddron Bald and Albright Grove, the oldest hardwood forest in the park. You'll pass the small Baxter Cabin on the way.

Greenbrier Entrance-

One of the lesser-used entrances to GSMNP, the Greenbrier River offers numerous swimming holes and places to have a picnic. Several trailheads can be found here, including Porter's Creek and Ramsey Cascades.

Cosby Nature Trail-

An easy 1.2 mile loop, good for all skill levels. The trail follows a beautiful stream, with several log bridge crossings during the hike.

Cosby Entrance-

Perfect for a picnic, or to start your hike to Hen Wallow Falls or Mt. Cammerer!

Hen Wallow Falls-

A 4.4 mile moderate hike to a 90ft waterfall! Access using Gabes Mountain Trail.

Mt. Cammerer-

A difficult 11.1 mile hike to a fire tower with spectacular views. This is one of the more challenging hikes in the area, so be prepared with plenty of food, water, light, and a map.

Hartford-

If white water rafting is your thing, there are quite a few guide companies in Hartford to help you find some rapids.

Max Patch-

While there aren't many dog friendly hikes in the park, Max Patch is a short drive away in Hot Springs, NC. One of our favorite balds in the area.

Townsend-

Rent a tube for a leisurely float down the river.

Vee Hollow Mountain Biking Course-

If you've brought your bike, Vee Hollow is a 14-mile mountain bike trail network, free to use and open year-round.

Sugarlands-

The main visitors center for GSMNP.
