



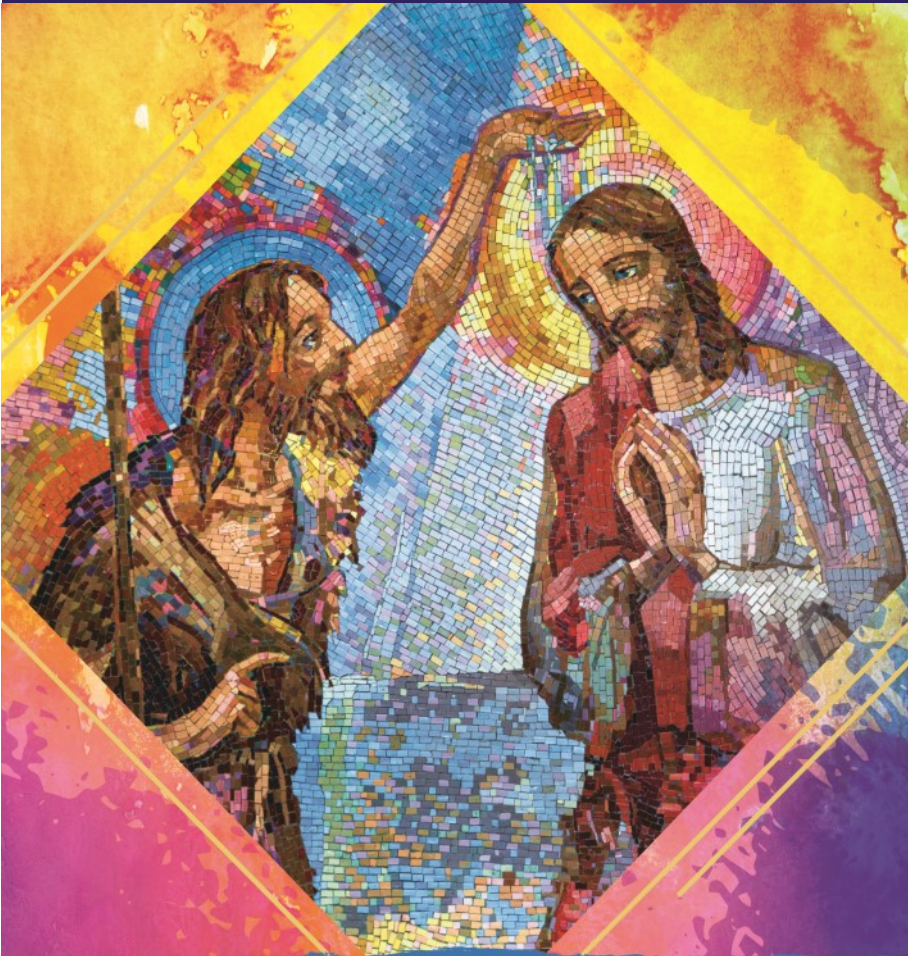

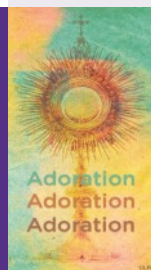

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Following the Christmas season each year, we spend some time following the Lord through the beginning of his public ministry: how he taught, healed, and above all reached out to so many people. Let's enjoy this simple time once again out on the road with Jesus.

Reflecting on how we as a parish can join in the on-going task of reaching people with the good news of God's love, I found myself struck by an interesting statistic that Deacon David showed me: our Mass attendance across the Christmas weekend was about the same as what we had been seeing on our strongest weekends throughout the fall (about 1200+ people over four Masses). That's a very encouraging observation: it means the people of St. Thomas are equally committed to gathering with our community when it's a holiday and when it's an ordinary Sunday. Thanks for giving such a strong witness to your love for the Lord.

At the same time, that statistic means that we've got a challenge. In decades past, Christmas and Easter attendance tended to be far higher than an average Sunday, due to many people who would only attend with family on those days. Their habit of coming to church a couple times a year used to give us an easy way to reach them: make sure they had a positive and welcoming experience on those holidays. But it seems like one of the cultural changes that the pandemic has accelerated is that people whose connection with the Catholic Church is very weak tend not to come even for the big holidays.

Which means, brothers and sisters, that we've got our work cut out for us. If we're going to follow Jesus in reaching out to others, we're going to have to make a point of doing more than just welcoming the people who come in the front door (even though that welcome remains very important!). I invite everyone to join me in my own New Years' resolution to pray and brainstorm about ways to reach our neighbors in this new moment.

Through the intercession of Mary, the Queen of the Apostles, and our patron St. Thomas, may the Lord send us the gifts of the Spirit to help reach all people with his Good News.

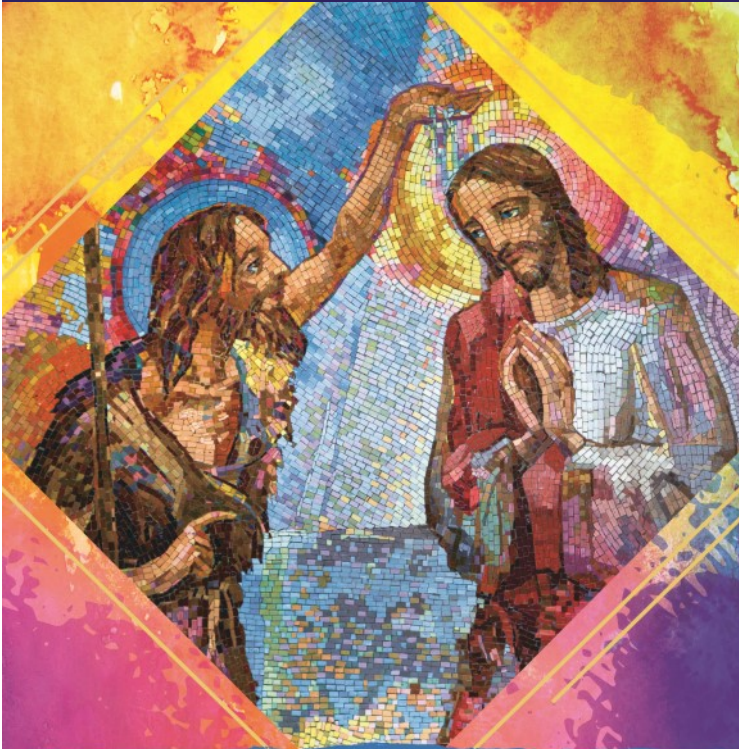

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

Cada año, después de la temporada navideña, pasamos un tiempo siguiendo al Señor en el comienzo de su ministerio público: cómo enseñó, sanó y se conectó con tantas personas. Disfrutemos este tiempo una vez más en el camino con Jesús.

Reflexionando sobre cómo nuestra parroquia podemos unirnos a Su trabajo de difundir la buena nueva del amor de Dios, me sorprendió una estadística: el numero de las personas a las Misas Navideñas fue de aproximadamente lo mismo que hemos tenido en los fines de semana durante otoño (alrededor de 1200+ personas en cuatro Misas). Esa es una observación muy positiva: significa que la gente de St. Thomas está igualmente comprometida a reunirse con nuestra comunidad cuando es un día festivo y cuando es un domingo normal. Gracias por dar un testimonio tan fuerte de su amor por el Señor.

Al mismo tiempo, esa estadística significa que tenemos un desafío. En tiempos pasados, la asistencia en Navidad y Pascua fue más alta que un domingo normal, debido a que muchas personas solo asistían en las fiestas principales. Su hábito de venir a la Iglesia un par de veces al año solía darnos una manera fácil de llegar a ellos: asegurarnos de que tuvieran una experiencia positiva y acogedora en los días festivos. Pero parece que uno de los cambios culturales que ha acelerado la pandemia es que las personas cuya conexión con la Iglesia Católica es muy débil tienden a no venir ni siquiera a las grandes fiestas.

Lo que significa, hermanos y hermanas, que tenemos mucho trabajo. Si vamos a seguir a Jesús para llegar a los demás, vamos a tener que esforzarnos por hacer más que simplemente dar la bienvenida a las personas que entran por la puerta principal (¡aunque nuestra bienvenida sigue siendo muy importante!). Invito a todos a unirse a mí en la resolución del Año Nuevo para orar y pensar de ideas sobre como podemos anunciar la Buena Noticia de Jesucristo en este nuevo momento cultural.

Por la intercesión de María, Reina de los Apóstoles, y de Santo Tomás, que el Señor nos envíe los dones del Espíritu para llegar a todas las personas con su Evangelio.
