



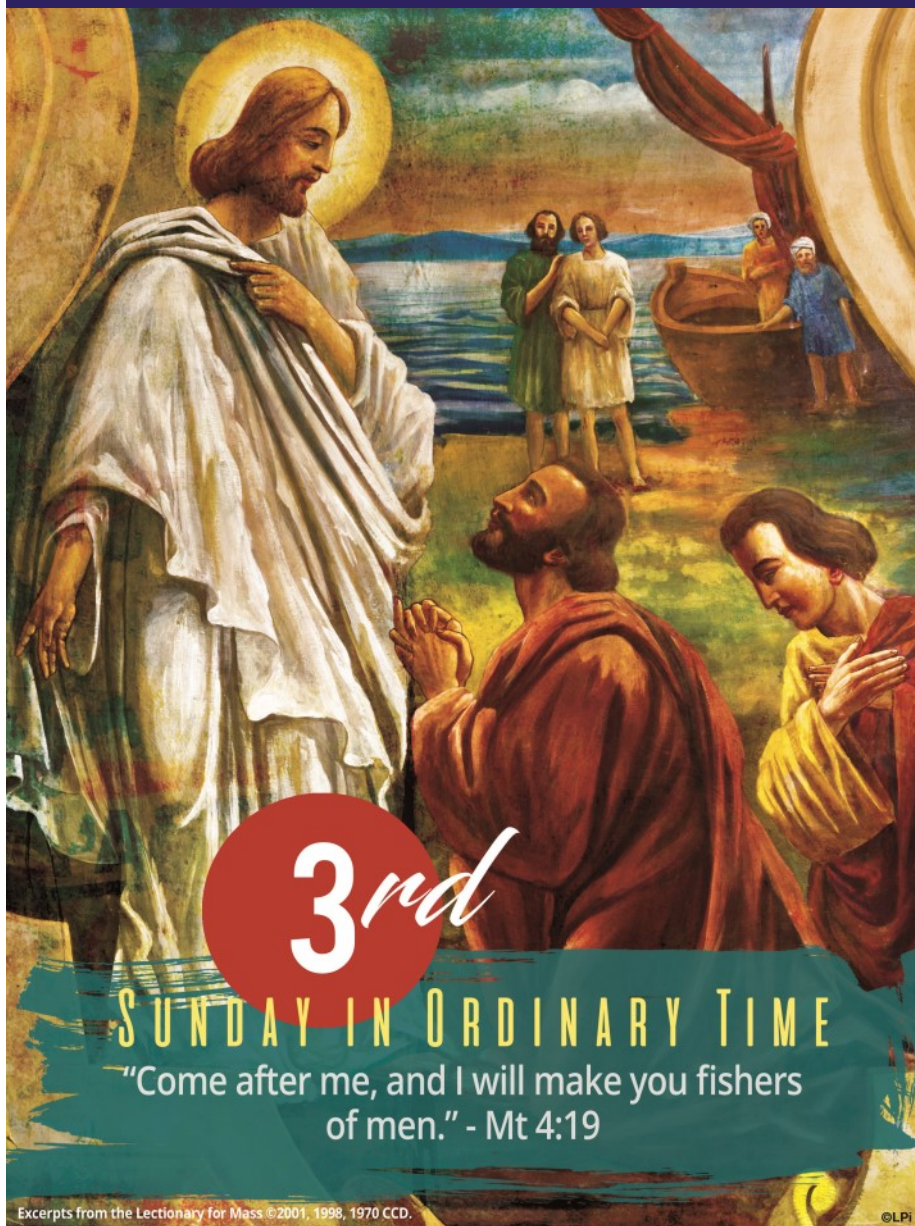

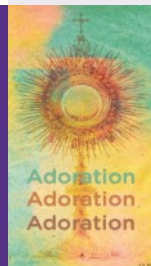

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Here's an interesting trend you might have noticed. I remember when I was a kid that Catholics had a reputation of not knowing much about the Bible. But one of the things I've noticed in recent years is that nowadays, Catholics usually know the basic stories of Scripture, and especially the stories of Jesus' life, extremely well—very different than the reputation we used to have! The way that the Church has opened up the treasury of God's Word to the faithful in our native languages over the past 60 years has made a real difference in so many lives. Helping to do that is one of my favorite things about being a priest.

To celebrate that trend—and also to help strengthen it—a few years ago, Pope Francis asked the Church to begin a new tradition: on the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time in January, to celebrate the Word of God in a special way. As part of our observance of this Sunday of the Word of God, I'd like to offer a few words here to deepen our reverence for Scripture.

What is the Bible? Very simply, a collection of documents written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit that authoritatively witness to how God has revealed Himself to humankind. And the words of Scripture aren't just about the past—through them, God continues to speak to us, testifying to His love and desire for all of us to be saved.

This is why, in 1964, the Second Vatican Council wrote: “The Church has always venerated the divine Scriptures just as she venerates the body of the Lord, since, especially in the sacred liturgy, she unceasingly receives and offers to the faithful the bread of life from the table both of God's word and of Christ's body.” In other words, the readings from Scripture in the first half of Mass parallel the receiving of Holy Communion in the second half of Mass. In both, God's Word becomes present to us and gives new life to our spirit.

Through the intercession of Mary, the Queen of the Apostles, and our patron St. Thomas, let's renew our commitment as God's People to listen always to His Holy Word. My prayer is that he will speak to all of us through the words of Scripture, this weekend and every time we gather!

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

Hay una tendencia interesante que quizás hayas notado en los últimos años. Recuerdo cuando era niño que los católicos tenían la reputación de no saber mucho sobre la Biblia. Pero una de las cosas que he notado en los últimos años es que hoy en día, muchos católicos conocen las historias básicas de las Escrituras, y especialmente las historias de la vida de Jesús, muy bien, ¡muy diferente de nuestra reputación en el pasado! La forma en que la Iglesia ha abierto el tesoro de la Palabra de Dios a los fieles en nuestros idiomas nativos durante los últimos 60 años ha marcado una diferencia real en muchas vidas. Una de mis cosas favoritas como sacerdote es el trabajo de seguir ayudando a todos a entender mejor la Palabra de Dios.

Para celebrar esa tendencia, y también para ayudar a fortalecerla, hace unos años, el Papa Francisco nos pidió a comenzar una nueva tradición: celebrar la Palabra de Dios de una manera especial, cada Tercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario en enero. Como parte de nuestra observancia de este Domingo de la Palabra de Dios, quisiera ofrecer algunas palabras aquí para profundizar nuestra reverencia por las Escrituras.

¿Qué es la Biblia? Muy simple, una colección de documentos escritos bajo la inspiración del Espíritu Santo que atestiguan con autoridad cómo Dios se ha revelado a la humanidad. Y las palabras de las Escrituras no son solo sobre el pasado; a través de ellas, Dios continúa hablándonos, testificando de su amor y deseo que todos seamos salvos.

Por eso el Concilio Vaticano II en 1964 escribió: "La Iglesia ha venerado siempre las Sagradas Escrituras al igual que el mismo Cuerpo del Señor, no dejando de tomar de la mesa y de distribuir a los fieles el pan de vida, tanto de la palabra de Dios como del Cuerpo de Cristo, sobre todo en la Sagrada Liturgia." En otras palabras, las lecturas de las Escrituras en la primera mitad de la Misa son como la recepción de la Sagrada Comunión en la segunda mitad. En esas dos maneras, la Palabra de Dios se hace presente en nosotros y da nueva vida a nuestro espíritu.

Por intercesión de María, la Reina de los Apóstoles, y de Santo Tomás, renovemos nuestro compromiso como Pueblo de Dios de escuchar siempre Su Santa Palabra. ¡Mi oración es que nos hable a todos a través de las palabras de las Escrituras, este fin de semana y cada vez que nos reunamos!
