







Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It's hard to believe, but we're only a little over a week away from Lent. 2023 is flying by, and Ash Wednesday is coming on February the 22nd!

You'll be hearing about lots of activities going on in the parish during the Lenten season, but for now, I'd mostly like to offer an invitation to everyone to start praying about how to make the upcoming "Christian spring training" an effective one for you.

My recommendation is usually to look for a balanced approach: commit to some extra prayer; do some fasting; and look for ways to be generous with time, talent, and treasure, especially for those who are in need. And it's important for us to look at these Lenten disciplines not as something that we've chosen for ourselves but rather as something the Lord is calling us to do. Not just picking out a practice because it makes us feel good or flatters our pride, but because we feel that God is asking us to grow in that specific way.

With just over a week to go, now is a good time to start bringing our ideas before the Lord to discern His will for a holy Lent. I look forward to seeing everyone on Ash Wednesday, at our Fish Fry and Stations of the Cross each Friday, and at the many other special activities that will be coming up so soon.

Through the prayers of Our Lady and St. Thomas, let's ask God to show us the path for us to walk the Lenten journey together.

Lenten Fast and Abstinence

On Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and each Friday of Lent, Catholics who are in good health and are at least 14 years old are obliged to abstain from eating meat (including beef, pork, chicken, and other animals). There is also an obligation to fast on Ash Wednesday (2/22) and Good Friday (4/7) for Catholics in good health from ages 18 through 59. Fasting for this discipline means only one full meal on those days, plus up to two light meals, but no food in between. Catholics are also encouraged to express interior penance in other ways, especially prayer, corporal and spiritual works of mercy, and charity to those in need.

K of C Fish Fry 2/24



Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

Con poco más de una semana hasta esa temporada, ahora es un buen momento para comenzar a llevar nuestras ideas ante el Señor para discernir su voluntad para una Cuaresma santa. Espero verlos a todos el Miércoles de Ceniza, en nuestro Pescado Frito y Vía Crucis cada viernes, y en las muchas otras actividades especiales que se realizarán muy pronto.
