

How's Lent going for everyone? I hope it's been a good one for every member of our parish, filled with experiences of God's presence and grace at each moment.

Since we're approaching the halfway mark of this holy season (where does time go?), I thought I would renew a couple special invitations that we have for deeper prayer, fasting, generosity, and gathering.

First, our parish Fish Fry and Stations of the Cross series is continuing over the coming Fridays. On March 17, we will hear from Fr. Eric Gami, a priest who recently came to Birmingham from Africa. He has many amazing stories of faith and the Cross from his years of ministry in his home country to share with us. On March 24, we will welcome Fr. Third, our Lenten Cross and Rice Bowl activities are continuing. These are excellent ways to share the blessings God has given us with other people. Please consider getting involved, if you haven't already done so.

With renewed energy from these special observances, let's continue to strive forward along the way of the Cross this Lent. Sustained by the continual prayers of Blessed Mary Ever-Virgin and St. Thomas, we'll arrive together at the joys of the Resurrection at Easter, in just a few short weeks.

Lenten Fast and Abstinence

On Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and each Friday of Lent, Catholics who are in good health and are at least 14 years old are obliged to abstain from eating meat (including beef, pork, chicken, and other animals). There is also an obligation to fast on Ash Wednesday (2/22) and Good Friday (4/7) for Catholics in good health from ages 18 through 59. Fasting for this discipline means only one full meal on those days, plus up to two light meals, but no food in between. Catholics are also encouraged to express interior penance in other ways, especially prayer, corporal and spiritual works of mercy, and charity to those in need.
