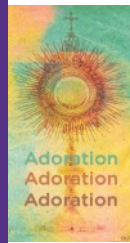

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Lord's words in today's Gospel are striking. As Jesus points out the image of the emperor stamped on a coin, he says, "Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God." The disciples probably wondered what exactly does belong to God, that it should be repaid to him. And the answer to that question is simple: we ourselves are stamped with the image of God.

After all, the Scriptures tell us, that God formed man and woman in his image and likeness. Which means that all that we have and all that we are come from him. Every talent and every moment are his. He has given the gifts of life and breath through his generosity, and Jesus' teaching is clear: "Repay to God what belongs to God." We give him back ourselves.

This weekend and next, as we continue with Stewardship Month, we have an opportunity to do exactly that. For this Saturday and Sunday, we'll be focusing in on opportunities to become involved in liturgical ministries—ways that we use our talents to worship God and serve our community.
