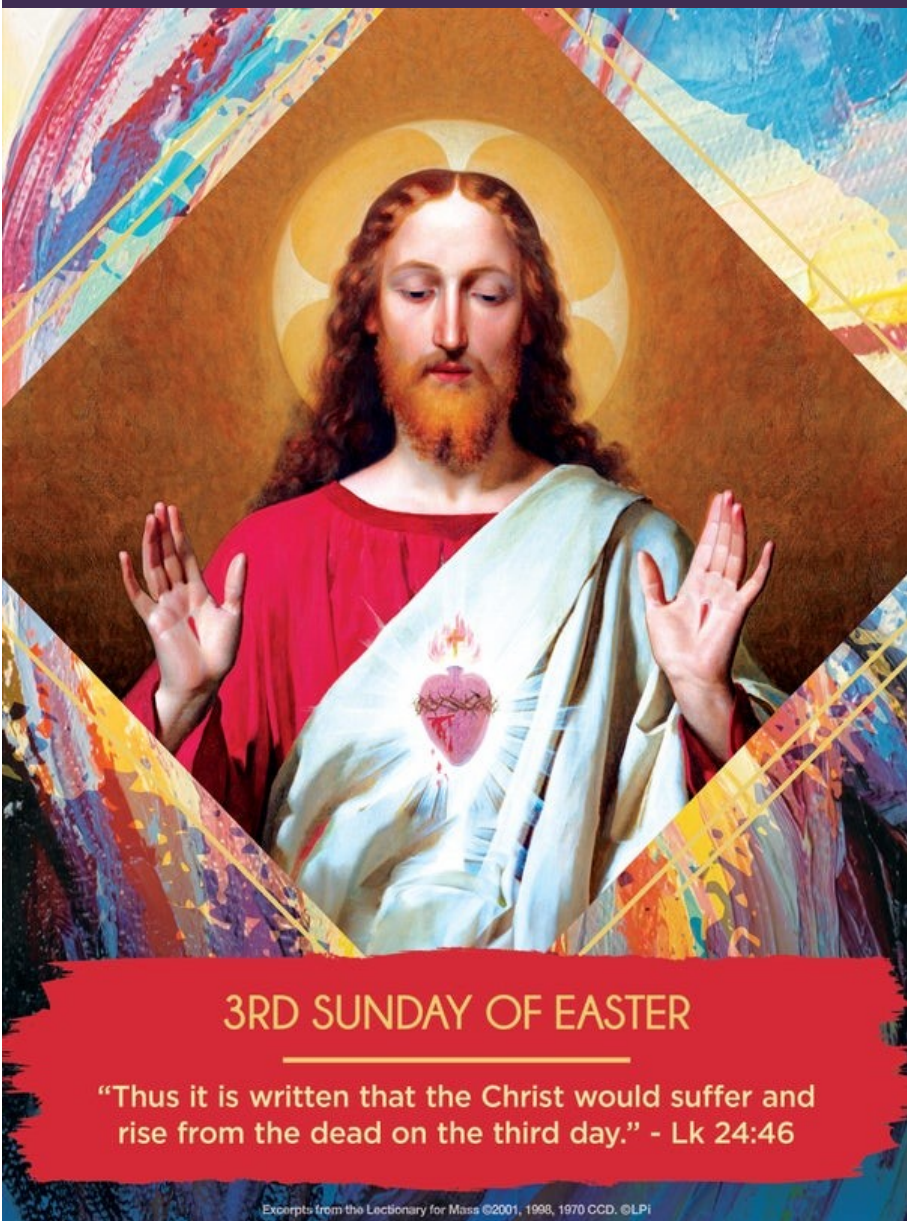

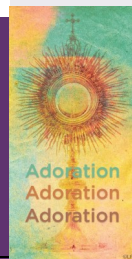

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In the ancient church, the Easter season was considered a time of “mystagogy:” going deeper into the mysteries of our redemption. In those days, the catechumens heard the Creed and saw the celebration of the Eucharist for the first time after they were baptized at the Easter Vigil. Then everyone would reflect more deeply on those central truths of the faith in the weeks after Easter, seeing them anew through the eyes of the recently initiated.

With that in mind, I'd like to mention a few things going on in the parish that can help us make this season a time of mystagogy for us, as well. First, for the next few weeks, I'm planning to preach on the sacraments. I hope this will be helpful to anyone new to our parish, and maybe it will be a good refresher for all of us to look at the basics. If you'd like to go a bit deeper at home, I'm reading a nice recent anthology on the sacraments edited by J.F. Baldwin, S.J., and D.F. Turnbloom: *Catholic Sacraments: A Rich Source of Blessings*.

Second, we're coming to the end of the Faith Formation year, which means that it is almost time to register for next year. For families with kids of the appropriate ages (kindergarten through 8th grade, plus high school Confirmation), please be on the look-out for early registration information. It will be held the first weekend of May, and we will also open online registration at the same time. Let's make sure that the youngest members of our community have a chance to go deeper!

Third, as you make your summer plans, be sure to circle the week of June 24–28, which will be our Vacation Bible School. This is always a great moment for people across our parish to come together and give our young people a great experience of God's love. I look forward to seeing you there!

In this Easter season, may the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Thomas lead us all more deeply into the wondrous mystery of Christ's all-merciful love.

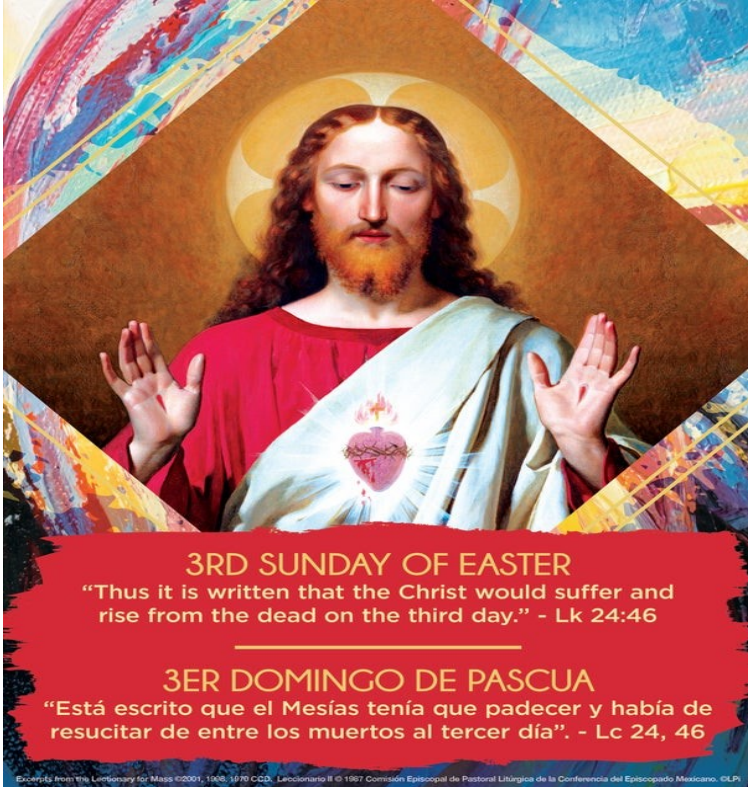

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

En la iglesia antigua, el tiempo pascual se consideraba un tiempo de "mistagogia:" profundizar en los misterios de nuestra redención. En aquellos días, los catecúmenos escucharon el Credo y vieron por primera vez la celebración de la Eucaristía después de ser bautizados en la Vigilia Pascual. Luego, en las semanas después de la Pascua, todos reflexionarían más profundamente sobre esas verdades centrales de la fe, viéndolas de nuevo a través de los ojos de los recién iniciados.

Con eso en mente, me gustaría mencionar algunas cosas que suceden en la parroquia que pueden ayudarnos a hacer de esta temporada un tiempo de mistagogia para nosotros también. Primero, durante las próximas semanas planeo predicar sobre los sacramentos. Espero que esto sea útil para cualquier persona nueva en nuestra parroquia, y tal vez sea un buen repaso para que todos veamos los conceptos básicos. Si quieres profundizar un poco más en casa, estoy leyendo una bonita antología por Papa Francisco: "Catequesis sobre los siete sacramentos." Está disponible gratis en línea: <https://multimedia.opusdei.org/pdf/es/papa-francisco-catequesis-sacramentos.pdf>

En segundo lugar, estamos llegando al final del año de Formación de Fe, lo que significa que ya casi es hora de registrarse para el próximo año. Para familias con niños de las edades apropiadas (desde jardín de infantes hasta octavo grado, más confirmación de escuela secundaria), estén atentos a la información sobre inscripción temprana. Se llevará a cabo el primer fin de semana de mayo y también abriremos la inscripción en línea al mismo tiempo. ¡Asegúrenos de que los miembros más jóvenes de nuestra comunidad tengan la oportunidad de profundizar más!

En tercer lugar, al hacer sus planes para el verano, asegúrese de marcar con un círculo la semana del 24 al 28 de junio, que será nuestra Escuela Bíblica de Vacaciones. Este es siempre un gran momento para que las personas de nuestra parroquia se reúnan y brinden a nuestros jóvenes una gran experiencia del amor de Dios. Espero verlos allí!

En este tiempo pascual, que la intercesión de la Santísima Virgen María y de San Pedro Tomás nos lleva a todos más profundamente al maravilloso misterio del amor misericordioso de Cristo.
