1. Dr Lesley Thulani Luthuli



Dr Lesley Thulani Luthuli is a full member of SAMRO and a film composer since 1988 and scored over a 100 Drama series and logos for the SABC. Dr Luthuli also serve on committees of the International Confederation of Societies of Authors and Composers (CISAC) the world's leading network of authors' societies on an international level and is the co-founder of the Pan African Composer Songwriters Association (PACSA) which works with CISAC and CIAM, ALCAM on the lobbying of the copyright harmonisation and modernisation where PACSA also serves as an observer on WIPO.

His expertise included the participation in the safe harbour provisions with CIAM and CISAC. These are some of the skillsets that will be invaluable in the management of the repertoire managed by SAMRO and the governance thereof. He holds a PhD from the Economic and Management Sciences faculty

(NWU) with business administration and thesis on Copyright Law, title *Re-engineering the Copyright Dividend in the illegal copyright market*. The expertise he brings into the SAMRO board are and not limited to;

3. Louise Bulley




