Blockchain Standards Roadmap Workshop

FRIDAY 17 FEBRUARY 2017

With the world first ISO/TC 307 International Blockchain Standards meeting set to be held in Sydney in April 2017, Standards Australia will be facilitating a number of key activities to support the Blockchain Standards Initiative. The first of these will be the development of a Blockchain Standards Roadmap.

The road mapping exercise, involving the undertaking of a survey, the hosting of a workshop and the delivery of a recommendations report, is designed to identify key stakeholder issues and develop a priority list of standards for development to support blockchain technology.

The Workshop, which will be held on Friday 17 February 2017, will be informed by the results of the survey undertaken by Standards Australia.

The Workshop will provide an opportunity to assess the key findings of the survey, hear from government, industry and research representatives on blockchain standards priorities, and provide a public forum for Australia's leadership in the development of international blockchain standards.

All relevant Australian stakeholders are invited to participate in the road mapping exercise.
