



Locate every "IN" in a storybook. Point to, read and show your child the word on the page. Point to the "in" symbol of the picture.	Get your child to help put the silverware away. Each time you put I item IN say "The silverware goes IN the drawer." and point to the "in" symbol	While putting clothes in a hamper, gain child's attention. Point to Symbol of IN and say "clothes go IN the hamper". Repeat while putting the clothes "in".	
When it is bed time, point to IN symbol and tell child "Let's go IN the bedroom." Once there, "Time to get IN bed"	While child is dressing, point to IN symbol & say "You are putting your arm IN the sleeve. Now put your leg IN your pants".	Look at some family pictures with your child. Talk about who is IN the picture(s) & point to the symbol "IN". EX: Look, Mom is IN the picture!	
When doing laundry, have child help carry clean close to drawers/closet. Point to IN symbol and talk about different items being out IN drawer/closet.	After dinner, have child help with clean up. Say statements such as "The cup goes IN the sink. The napkin goes IN the trash." Point to IN symbol while talking.	Gain your child's attention. Say, "Let's find all the cars IN your room." Continue finding items IN different rooms using similar statements and the "IN" symbol.	
Ask you child "Do you want to get IN the bath or IN the shower?" when it is time to bath. Point to the IN symbol when you ask the question.	Watch a 30 minute age appropriate show. Make statements as you are watching and incorporate IN verbally and with the symbol. For example: He is IN a car.	When it is time to go somewhere, say to your child "It is time to get IN the car.", while pointing to the symbol.

(IN symbol posted next to main door & available in several locations within family room) Examples of use: *Go put your shoes IN your room. *Jackets go IN the closet. *Time to go get IN the car. *Plug IN your device.	(IN symbol posted next to main door, near sink, & bathtub/shower) Examples of use: *Get IN tub/shower. *Put IN hair. *Towels are IN the cabinet. *Spit IN sink. *Put IN hamper/basket
(IN symbol posted on fridge, at least 1 cabinet and 1 drawer & available on table.) Examples of use: *Sit IN your chair. *Cups go IN the sink. *Napkin goes IN the trash. *Put the spoons IN the sink. *The milk is IN the fridge.	(IN symbol posted on closet door, 1 drawer, etc.,) Examples of use: *Time to get IN bed. *You are putting your feet IN your shoes. *Let's get IN your PJs. *This goes IN the drawer. *That goes IN your closet.
