
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A war is a time of fighting between countries.








Japan Bombs Pearl Harbor






The country of Japan was trying to expand in the Pacific.

Japan is an island in the Pacific Ocean.




Hawaii is part of the United States, and it is also in the Pacific Ocean.

After his speech, Congress declared war against Japan.






The attack on Pearl Harbor brought the United States into the war.

This terrible killing of thousands of people is called the *Holocaust*.








Only 6 months after the attack on Pearl Harbor Japan attacked

The Battle of Midway was the first major victory for the Allies against Japan.




The Battle of Midway was a turning point in the Pacific War.

June 6, 1944, the Allies landed on the beaches of Normandy, France.










The Allies moved into Europe and liberated Paris by August 1944.






Japan refuses to surrender to the Allies.

Three days later a second bomb is dropped on Nagasaki, Japan.










On September 2, 1945, Japan surrenders.
