



Parents, it is your turn to model AAC with your child. Use the "HE" symbol that you have posted in your home to complete each square below. Return to school once each activity is complete.



Locate every "He" in a storybook which contains this word. Point to, read and show your child the word on the page. Point to the "He" symbol of the picture.	Point to pictures of male characters in books. Point to the "He" symbol while you describe what you see. EX: "HE is wearing a red shirt. HE is excited. HE is running."	Point to male family members in family photos. Point to the symbol "He" as you talk. EX: "He is your uncle. He is taller than your aunt. He lives there. He is opening presents."
Play a "Who has?" game. Looking at pictures in a book or magazine ask "Who has (a blue shirt/brown hair/a bike)?". Point to character and model "HE does" while also using the HE symbol.	Play Legos or with similar toys with your child. Using a building or boat and a male figure. Model playing and narrate. "HE is on top. Oh look! HE is jumping down. HE is running."	Draw pictures with your child. Talk about the pictures using your HE symbol. EX: "Look, I drew what we saw at the park today. This is a boy that was playing. HE was sliding."
Looking at a family picture or picture in a book. Point to characters and ask your child silly questions. "Does HE have purple hair? No, HE has brown hair.", etc. Point to the HE symbol.	Use the QR code to share a video/song with your child. Use the HE symbol when appropriate during the song. Watch 5 times. You can extend this activity by making up new verses using HE.	Draw faces of 5 different emotions or show pictures showing feelings. Show your child I at a time and say what the person is and is not feeling. "HE looks happy. HE is sad", "HE is not mad. HE is tired", etc. Point to the HE symbol when appropriate.
Use this QR to watch a video about modeling AAC without expectation. Watch it on 3 different occasions before checking off as completed.	During family meals, games or other activities use the HE symbol to talk to the other family members. EX: Did HE finish his food? HE needs to take a bath. Even if your child is not part of the conversation, this will increase your use and AAC as part of your family language and support for your child's language development.	HE uses words. 









Home AAC and Aided Stimulated Language






