Everyone can benefit from both high


and light tech AAC.

DON'T GIVE "UP" ON AAC

AAC helps your child communicate and connect with the world. It allows for backand-forth communication like we do with our words. And here's the thing, using an AAC device doesn't mean your child is giving up on speaking! Instead, it gives them more ways to communicate and be successful. Plus, using pictures or voice-output can even encourage them to use their speech! Think of AAC as a handy tool to support your child's communication and encourage speech.

Use your AAC picture and model "The books go UP on this shelf. Can you pick UP those shoes for me?"
Play an adapted version of "I Spy" with your child. EX:" Can you see/find something red?". "I see a red cup UP on the shelf" using the AAC picture to emphasize UP when appropriate.	Use the QR code to share a video/song with your child. You can use your own UP symbol or point to the one in the video. Watch 5 times.	Draw faces of 5 different emotions or show pictures showing feelings. Show your child I at a time and say what the person is and is not feeling. "HE looks happy. HE is sad", "HE is not mad. HE is tired", etc. Point to the HE symbol when appropriate.
