

#### **FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT**

Our church is overflowing with faithful children of God who love and support the many ministries of COTS. We want to thank everyone for sharing their blessings to further the kingdom.

During the month of November, total income was \$91,496 versus a budget of \$112,749, which put us further behind our goal. However, this shortfall has not diminished our commitment to bring new life to the Greater Heights and beyond. On Sunday, December 1st we approved our 2020 budget totaling \$1,278,278 to support our local work and ministries around the world. On Saturday, December 7, we raised money to support the Fairfield Children's Home in Zimbabwe. And keeping with tradition, the Christmas offering will go to our very own Metro Missions.

On January 26, 2020, The Reverend Dr. Otis Moss Jr. will join us at the 11 am worship experience. Dr. Moss is a theologian, pastor, and civic leader. He is one of America's most influential religious leaders and highly sought-after public speakers. Dr. Moss was active in the Civil Rights movement, leading sitins while at Morehouse College, serving as regional director of the Southern Christian Leadership Council while serving at Mt. Zion Baptist Church in Lockland, Ohio, and participating in the civil rights march in Selma, AL alongside Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Dr. Moss' long pastoral career has included several churches including Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, GA, where he served alongside Rev. Martin Luther King, Sr. Most notably, he served the historic Olivet Institutional Baptist Church in Cleveland, Ohio for 33 years. During his time at the church, besides continuing to be a sought-after speaker and influential figure in social justice movements, he was an advisor to President Jimmy Carter and befriended such figures as President Bill Clinton, President Barack Obama, Oprah Winfrey, and Jesse Jackson who credits Dr. Moss with encouraging him to run for President.

Dr. Moss has received dozens of honors and awards, delivered lectures at hundreds of colleges and churches, and has done humanitarian work internationally. In 1997, Cleveland's University Hospital, in partnership with the Olivet Institutional Baptist Church created the Otis Moss Jr. Medical Center. For over 20 years, University Hospitals Otis Moss, Jr. Health Center has been serving the Greater Cleveland area and especially our neighbors in the Fairfax community.

He earned his B.A. degree from Morehouse College in 1956, his Masters of Divinity degree from the Morehouse School of Religion/ Interdenominational Theological Center in 1959, and his Doctorate of Ministry degree from the United Theological Seminary in 1990. Dr. Moss has been married to his wife, Edwina, for over fifty years and has three children, Kevin, Daphne (deceased), and Reverend Otis III. who has followed in his father's chosen vocation,. leading Trinity United Church of Christ in Chicago.

We are privileged to welcome Dr. Moss in worship and we hope you join us in honoring the work of God through the life of Dr. Moss.




## UNITED METHODIST WOMEN SPIRITUAL GROWTH STUDY TUESDAY, JANUARY 14

#### **WOMEN'S RETREAT**



#### YEE CHY RETIRES



"The best part of my work at Church of the Saviour is **the people,"** said Yee Chy as, after 38 years on the job, he prepares to retire from his position as head custodian. While he has enjoyed greeting and helping members and visitors, he has worked behind the scenes setting up rooms for meetings, keeping the heating, cooling and plumbing operating, plowing snow, repairing innumerable things about the church, and being on call in emergencies.

Yee arrived in Cleveland in 1981with his wife, Kim, her mother and two very young children, Larry and Vanny. (A daughter, Terry, was born in 1990). As refugees from Cambodia (via Thailand), the family was sponsored by what is now Disciples Christian Church in Cleveland Heights. Soon after arriving in Cleveland Yee was hired for a custodial position at COTS. He fit in well, because he had studied English in the refugee camp (and has continued to study English via the internet)

.Over the years, Yee has done some amazing work at the church. To repair electrical connections for the stage, he has crawled from the boiler room through a long, narrow tunnel underneath Calvary Hall. Before new lighting was installed in the Sanctuary's chancel area, Yee, being brave and agile, changed light bulbs over the baptismal font using an access through the floor of the clavier room above. After a truck had damaged the old overhang at what eventually became the Reinberger Entrance, Yee fell from a ladder as he was making repairs. Unfortunately, he was laid up for several months with a broken leg.

Always interested in improving his skills, Yee took evening classes at Max Hayes Vocational School and Tri-C (Western Campus) and received certificates of completion in auto mechanics, welding and plumbing. When he became a U.S. citizen in 1987, Yee purchased a home in Cleveland Heights. His three children are Heights High alums and college graduates. Yee's wife, a seamstress, worked for years at Peter's Tailor Shop, but now cares for their two grandchildren several days a week. One sure thing that Yee will do in retirement is to visit relatives in Cambodia for longer periods of time than he has been able to do in the past.
