
## **BASKETBALL QUEENSLAND STATISTICIAN GUIDE**



## **Statistics Level Flow Chart**

The Statistics Level Flow Chart shows the progression steps a statistician takes as they progress from a Trainee to a Level 1, 2 and 3 statisticians. The steps in the Trainee to Level 1 section allow the statistician to progress using the state or territories current context. The statistics evaluator and stats coach will play an integral role in guiding statisticians through each of the level sections.

## **Statistics Level Matrix**



To determine the overall level of the statistician the statistics evaluator uses the Statistics Level Matrix (see figure 1) by cross-referencing the Caller Evaluation Matrix Standard with the Evaluation Matrix Standard (on the next page of this document). For example, if a statistician was evaluated as a Competent Caller and a Competent Inputter they would be assessed as a Level 2 statistician. It is important to note that statisticians are not seen as a particular level for calling or inputting but rather as a particular standard (e.g. Excellent Caller or Competent Inputter etc.). The evaluator should use the level matrix when evaluating a statistician who has met the service period guidelines and is able to undertake a practical level-up assessment.

## **Service Periods and Assessment Guidelines**



The service period and assessment guidelines have been designed to assist the statistics evaluator to make an informed decision about the point in time a statistician typically progresses to the next level based on the number of games they have capture stats for and the experienced required to reach the desired standard for progression. The details in the below table are intended as recommendations for evaluators. The evaluator will reward competency and skill when it is demonstrated. The early advancement of a statistician is at the discretion of the statistics evaluator.

	Service Period	10+ games	Minimum of 30 games calling (including games done as a level 1 caller).			
Level 2	Notes	It may be appropriate to award a level 2 to a statistician who is an adequate inputter and an excellent caller.				
	Assessment	Level 2 Online Theory Test and Practical Assessment				
	Service Period	10+ games	Minimum of 50 games (including games done as a level 1 and level 2 caller).			
Level 3	Notes	It may be appropriate to award a level 3 to a statistician who is an adequate inputter and an outstanding caller.				
	Assessment	Level 3 Practical Assessment
