Homemade Mask-Making



During the COVID-19 Pandemic, the Department of Human Services asked for service providers to wear face masks. Since there were no masks available for purchase, we created a Trillium Mask Makers Group!

Our team of over 40 mask makers went into mask-making mode for a few weeks and made over 1000 masks! We had everyone from service recipients, direct service professionals, and management on our team to get this massive project done. We even created a Facebook Group to communicate what was needed, troubleshoot sewing machine problems, and show off our fun patterns and designs.

Several people donated materials to our cause. We stocked all of the supplies, and our wonderful team would pick up supplies and drop off their handmade masks to be distributed.

We had a goal of being able to provide at least two masks per person (for each person we support and employ) – and we have met that goal! On our best week, we were able to create 400 masks and were even able to make a whopping 185 masks in one day!

We could not have reached this goal without the help of our fantastic and dedicated mask makers – a HUGE "Thank You" goes out to our Trillium Mask Makers Team and those who donated materials!

She has been taking proper precautions like wearing a mask and gloves, washing her hands, and staying six feet away from customers.


She says she still enjoys working and is glad that she can help out. Nice job,

We also had a few people write letters to seniors and frontline workers to brighten their days!


