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
America's Housing Supply is in Crisis

Estimates for America's Housing Shortage: The gap between how many units exist and how many are demanded. Difficult to measure!

- Freddie Mac: 2.5 3.3 million
- **Up for Growth:** 3.9 million
- National Association of Realtors: 5.5 million
- National Low Income Housing Coalition: 7.3 million

Ultimately, it's less about national figures and more about certain markets where demand has far outpaced supply.








Housing Production Fell Behind After the 2008 Crisis

Housing Starts Relative to Population










"Missing Middle" Housing

- While single-family housing declined after 2008, 2-4 unit housing started to decline earlier as a result of land-use and zoning
- Between 1960-1999, U.S. averaged 89,000 permits for 2-4 unit housing; from 2000-2021, we averaged 40,000, a 55% decline

Average Annual Housing Units Permitted in the U.S., 2-4 Unit Buildings








Undersupply Drives Up Prices

How Does the Housing Affordability Affect Americans?

1. Burdensome Rents

- Evictions, housing instability, and homelessness

2. Limiting Homeownership

- Lack of entry level housing/starter homes
- Down payment costs are insurmountable
