- Always lean on staff and volunteers if you need anything
- Leave no trace
- BTV enforces a safe party culture. Have fun but be aware of your limits

Being respectful and considerate of others and the land on which you are dancing, camping and visiting is essential to the ongoing success of BTV. Our community enforces a safe party culture where festival goers can express and enjoy themselves within an inclusive safe space.

Welcome to Country

Beyond the Valley is extremely privileged and proud to support the Wadawurrung Traditional Custodians in delivering a Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony to mark the start of our four day camping festival.

The protocol of welcoming those who are visiting country has always been an element of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture, whether that be for welcoming other nations who had been given permission to enter the welcoming nation, or for recognising and celebrating culture to welcome non-Indigenous people to land.

We ask all to be present for the welcoming ceremony as a way of paying respects to the land and the traditional owners of our temporary home. Attending a Welcome to Country expresses to the traditional custodians your recognition, as a festival patron, that Barunah Plains, surrounding landscapes and the entire Australian continent always was and always will be Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander land.

The Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony will take place at the Dance Dome on Dec 29th at 2PM.

Smoking Ceremony and Welcome Speech:

A Welcome to Country holds great meaning for First Nations' Peoples. The Wadawurrung Peoples, who will be leading the ceremonies have explained the importance of this ceremony, and their expected respect that is shown by visitors following their Welcome. Barry Gilson - Proud Wadawurrung Man: What Welcome to Country means


"A Welcome to Country is a time honoured ceremony. It is a bestowing upon the visitors that is a rite of passage allowing all access to waterways and food sources. The ceremony is a peaceful experience and is the coming together of two cultures. It allows us to relearn, in togetherness, what was already learned. This is important so that we can heal this planet and understand the beauty of the past and strive as one towards understanding and healing. It gives us the opportunity to enjoy what we have into the future and protect forevermore the animals, the plants and the riverways. The Wadawurrung peoples believe that the smoke in a smoking ceremony cleanses the body and strengthens an individual's connection to the land. It is conducted in honour of Tharangalk "The Gum Leaf Country".

BTV acknowledges the importance of a Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony, we offer thanks and pay respect to the Wadawurrung peoples for providing this opportunity and for welcoming us to their land. As an event group, we will respect the land and to the best of our ability return it as we have found it. We hope that as patrons of Beyond the Valley Festival you will support us in that goal through being considerate and understanding of the importance of the land that you will walk on. We also hope to see you present at our Welcome to Country and following ceremonies, to pay your respect to the Wadawurrung peoples and their elders past and present.

Getting There - Buses

Let us handle how you're getting to and from BTV!

No matter what BTV Bus you're catching, please arrive at your departure location 30 minutes before it is scheduled to leave – if you miss your bus we can't guarantee a spot can be saved for you on the next one so please make sure you arrive early!

You are able to bring stored food onto the bus for camping purposes, however no eating or drinking is allowed on either bus (water is allowed). Before you head to your departure location, please double check your pass and ensure you are arriving at the correct time and address.

Staying On Site Buses

Camping at BTV? All Staying On Site Bus passes include a return service, meaning they will pick you up and drop you off at the same location. Each passenger is entitled to bring up to 3 bags (or equivalent - due to limited space, swags are not permitted to be brought onto the bus).

Staying On Site Buses will be departing to and from Melbourne CBD, Geelong, Torquay, Colac and Geelong.

Staying Off Site Buses

Staying off site? All Staying Off Site Bus passes include a return service, meaning they will pick you up and drop you off at the same location. Each passenger is entitled to bring 1 x A4 sized bag with them.

Staying Off Site Buses will be departing to and from Melbourne CBD, Geelong, Torquay, Colac and Geelong.

Staying off site? All Staying Off Site Bus passes include a return service, meaning they will pick you up and drop you off at the same location. Each passenger is entitled to bring 1 x A4 sized bag with them.

Staying Off Site Buses will be departing to and from Melbourne CBD, Geelong, Torquay, Colac and Geelong.

Getting There - Car

Drop Off / Pick Up

There will be a designated drop off area for patrons who are catching Uber's, Taxis or have arranged their own private transfer.

If you are being dropped off at BTV you are not required to purchase a vehicle pass. Please follow all signage directing you to the correct gate upon arrival. You must stay in your vehicle until you reach the designated drop off point to reduce cars banking up and for the overall safety of all festival goers!

Campsite Parking

If you are driving to BTV and have purchased a Vehicle Pass, you will be able to park your car at your campsite.

The speed limit throughout the campgrounds is 5km/h, please drive with your hazard lights on and keep an eye out for festival goers!

Once you have found your campsite and set up for the weekend you are not permitted to move your vehicle. Anyone found driving around the campgrounds will be penalised.

We strongly encourage you to have a plan in place ahead of time and have a designated driver organised who will commit to this responsibility for the weekend!

Getting There - Car

External Car Park

If you have purchased an External Car Park Pass, you will be able to park and leave your car in our designated car park, located beside the festival. As you enter, you will need to head with your belongings to your campsite. You are permitted to do multiple trips back and forth from your car – on arrival only.

The External Car Park is located just outside of the campgrounds and is only a short walk - just 100m!

To transport your items smoothly and quickly, follow our top packing tips:

- Bring a camping trolley
- Pack your belongings in a suitcase
- Strap your bags to your tolley with ratchet straps
- Try & pack as lightly as possible!

Please note, this pass does not permit your car to be parked in the campgrounds and you will not be able to access your car throughout the festival - until you are ready to leave.

Interstate & International Arrivals

Coming to Melbourne to bring in the New Year with us? The closest airport to BTV is Melbourne Airport.

The quickest way to get from Melbourne airport to BTV is by car which you can hire as you arrive or pre-book ready for pickup!

Don't intend on driving? You can head into the city to catch our BTV Charter Bus that will run directly from Melbourne CBD to the event.

Public Transport

Due to the location of our home at Barunah Plains and its natural surroundings, public transport options are limited.

If you wish to catch public transport, trains will depart from Southern Cross and head to Geelong Railway Station each day of the event. From here, you can catch the BTV Charter Bus by purchasing a Charter Bus pass ahead of time – this will take you directly to the festival!

Health & Wellbeing

Police

There will be a strong Police presence all throughout the weekend and surrounding the festival site. We support the efforts of the Victorian Police to help ensure this is a safe and enjoyable weekend for patrons and the broader community surrounding Barunah Plains.

There will be road operations going into and out of the event, searching vehicles and testing drivers who might be under the influence. Think twice before making a decision that could ruin your weekend and the future of BTV.

Emergency

In an event of an emergency you must listen to staff very carefully and follow any instructions given to you. Please leave your belongings behind or anything else that may slow you down.

We suggest frequently checking the info boards at Main Street and in the Main Arena to keep up to date with any warnings and emergency information that might be posted.

Medical Assistance

Your safety and wellbeing is our number one priority.

The best way to take care of yourself at Beyond The Valley is by keeping hydrated, eating regular meals, wearing a hat and remembering to pace yourself!

If you or someone you know requires medical attention at any point throughout

the weekend please visit one of our Medical Tents where trained staff are on hand 24 hours a day to assist you with whatever you may need.

The Medical Tents are a safe, confidential space, the medical team are there to take care of you and your friends regardless of the situation.

If you require medication to be stored for the festival please head directly to the Medical Tent when you arrive.

Familiarise yourself with the location of the Medical Tents by looking at your site map.

If you don't feel comfortable visiting the Medical Tent our Crowd Care team are there to assist, look out for the purple vests, they're trained staff who can assist you with anything you might need.

Health & Wellbeing

Medication

If you are required to take prescription medication, you will need to bring a copy of your current and valid script with you which will need to be shown at the front gate and at the Medical Tent. If your medication needs to be refrigerated, the staff at our medic tent will be able to store this for you throughout the festival!

identify your campground's Helper Hub when setting up your campsite.

Helper Hubs are located next to the toilets, showers and water supply in your campground. They will be staffed 24 hours a day – there to have a chat, provide assistance with anything you might need and will be stocked with basic supplies such as earplugs and bandaids.

Crowd Care

We strongly believe that your health should be the number one priority throughout the entire weekend - to prioritise this there will be a Crowd Care team who will patrol the campgrounds and the arena 24 hours a day.

Crowd Care staff come from many different backgrounds including nurses, social workers, paramedics and drug & alcohol counsellors – the one thing they will all have in common for the weekend are their purple hi-vis vests and their skills to assist in a variety of different situations.

It can be long summer days spent under the sunshine and for some of us, its been a while since we've partied or been to a festival - if there is anything you may need including medical assistance, support in a crisis or just a friendly face to chat to, please lean on our Crowd Care team.

Helper Hubs

Our Helper Hubs are the heart of the campgrounds. There will be 5 Helper Hubs placed at each campground area. Helper Hubs will be a designated colour as per their campground colour. We recommend you

Campgrounds

General Camp

A Festival Entry Ticket and a Camping Pass are both required to camp at Beyond The Valley.

Campgrounds operate on a first come, first serve basis. Camping spots can not be reserved or allocated to friends prior to or at the festival. There will be 7 different campgrounds, each designated by a specific colour and with its own Helper Hub:

Red Blue Yellow Green Orange Pink Purple Lime

Premium Camp

A Festival Entry Ticket and a Premium Camping Pass are both required to camp in Premium at Beyond The Valley.

Located directly over from the festival main arena, you'll be close to all the main attractions. Other inclusions are premium showers & toilets, shaded communal spaces with phone charging stations, exclusive entrance into the main arena and a 24 hour concierge.

Pre-Pitched Camp

A Festival Entry Ticket and a Pre-Pitched Pass are both required to camp in Pre-Pitched at Beyond The Valley.

The Tent Package will include a stretcher with foam bedding and the Tent Only pass will just include your tent srt-up and ready for the weekend!

Please note, those driving to BTV and camping in Pre-Pitched will require an Pre-Pitched Car Park Pass and will not be able to camp next to their vehicle.

Lux Camp

A Festival Entry Ticket and a Lux Package are both required to experience Lux Camping at Beyond The Valley.

The following packages will give you access to the Lux Campgrounds with premium shower & toilet facilities, private Lux Bar, private food truck and communal hangout spaces:

Arrival

On arrival, ticket scanning, car searches and wristbanding will take place at your respective gate. Due to the nature of these processes, there may be potential wait times to enter BTV. To speed up this process please have the following ready:

- Valid form of ID,
- Valid Festival Entry Tickets, Camping Tickets, Car and/or Bus Passes - Megatix is the only valid ticketing platform for BTV, with Tixel being the only valid resale platform. If you have purchased tickets from any other ticketing provider, please contact your point of purchase
- Tickets with details that match your name and personal information - this will be checked, if the names do not match you will be required to pay a fee at the Box Office. If you need to process a name change, please

do so in advance via Tixel

- There will be limited to no reception available, so please ensure the above is

Alcohol

Beyond the Valley is not a BYO event, and you will not be permitted to bring any alcohol into the festival and camp grounds whatsoever. Drinks can only be purchased and consumed in the event area, and the campgrounds are an alcohol free zone. Any alcohol found at campsites will be confiscated, and punters may be ejected from the event.

Be smart and safe with your alcohol consumption, know your limits and look out for your friends! Staying hydrated and eating regularly throughout the day is the best way to party safely.

Our Crowd Care Team will be around to help you out so please don't hesitate to approach them if you need any assistance.

ATMs & EFTPOS

There will be a number of easily accessible ATMs on site at Beyond The Valley, however, the ATMs will not be restocked so we recommend bringing enough cash with you to last for the weekend, just in case!

All bars and food vendors at Beyond The Valley will be cashless. This means you will only be able to use your credit/debit card to purchase food and drinks.

Some market stalls will accept cash so we recommend having both cash and a card/s on hand!

Better Beer Beach Club

BTV are bringing the beach to you this New Years, with the Better Beer Beach Club. The Beach Club will have an elevated design for our eighth edition.

Expect additional curated chill areas, a bespoke bar serving delicious drinks and an expansion of pool side offerings including more shade and day beds.

Be transported to a mediterranean beach club paradise, with daily entertainment from DJ's playing the best of balearic and laidback house music.

Campgrounds

A Festival Entry Ticket and a Camping Pass are both required to camp at Beyond The Valley.

Campgrounds operate on a first come, first serve basis. Camping spots can not be reserved or allocated to friends prior to or at the festival.

Respect your neighbours by keeping noise to a minimum after dark! There will be a strong presence of staff patrolling campgrounds. We encourage you to lock away any valuables and to secure your camping gear with tent pegs and ropes. If you see something that makes you feel uncomfortable or if you need any help look out for our event staff team who will be wearing yellow high vis vests and our Crowd Care staff who will be wearing purple high vis vests.

It is essential that our temporary home is taken care of for years to come – to help us achieve this, campsite cleanliness will be a major focus. Campsites found littered with waste will be penalised and attendees from this campsite will be banned from attending Beyond The Valley in the future.

We encourage you to invest in good quality camping equipment that will last the duration of the festival and for future festivals to avoid equipment ending up in landfill at the end of the weekend.

If your campsite requires more garbage bags over the weekend, don't hesitate to visit your closest info hub or ask a member of the team who will be able to provide you with more information.

Carbon Offsetting

Did you know that we will be offsetting 100% of patron transport this year? We will once again be working with Treecreds to ensure this will go towards the purchase of carbon credits to offset this large environmental impact.

Community

The BTV community continues to grow each year with both new and old friends. This year, our home is evolving at Barunah Plains. It may be your first year attending BTV, or maybe you're a loyal attendee – either way, you have a responsibility to follow our community guidelines.

Being respectful and considerate of others and the land on which you are dancing, camping and visiting is essential to the ongoing success of BTV. Our community enforces a safe party culture where festival goers can express and enjoy themselves within an inclusive safe space.

Cooking Equipment

Cooking equipment including gas stoves and hot plates are not permitted. These items left unattended in hot weather, with strong winds and on grass can be a major fire and safety hazard. We understand that not having access to cooking equipment means you need to be a little more creative with meal times but if quick and easy is what you prefer we've got you covered - head down to the Food Village for a wide range of delicious food and cuisines!

Esky's are allowed and are a fantastic way to keep your food fresh and your water cool all weekend.

Convoy

Have a convoy plan in place - campsites can not be allocated or reserved so we recommend arriving with your friends!

To drive with less stress and with the added bonus of companionship, we strongly encourage you to arrive in style by carpooling with your friends. Carpooling extends beyond just saving money, with fewer cars driving to and from BTV you will be significantly reducing your carbon footprint this summer!

The Dance Dome

Larger & louder than ever before, the evolution of our iconic Dance Dome will continue this year. An institution for electronic music enthusiasts, every detail has been meticulously curated and expanded upon in 2023; from the architectural design, to the world-class sound & lighting, to the dynamic programming.

Witness the likes of Mall Grab, Jayda G, DJ Heartstring, Lady Shaka, Kettama, Effy, Rebūke & more here in just one month's time.

DanceWize

If you see something that makes you feel uncomfortable and you need to chat to someone please head to the DanceWize Tent. The team here can help with and chat through any situation (confidentially) and will also provide a chill out space if you would like a break from the festival.

Departure

Patrons who wish to leave the event and go home are permitted to leave at any point throughout the weekend. Please note, once you leave BTV you will not be able to re-enter.

Music will conclude on the Sunday night, however festival goers who are driving are encouraged to stay until Monday to rest and recover. All attendees must exit the site by evening on Monday.

Before you get behind the wheel, head to the BMFHQ site and take a drug and alcohol test to ensure you and your friends get home safely. We urge you to have a plan in place by organising your designated driver ahead of time. To ensure the safety of surrounding communities and other festival goers, designated drivers must be aware of this responsibility and do their due diligence.

Music will conclude on Sunday night.
However If you are not under the legal BAC limit or do not feel ready to drive on Sunday morning, our site will be open until late in the day and we encourage you to rest and recover before heading off. Let this be the safest decision you make all weekend. If staying, please notify your closest Helper Hub staff member.

Directions

The journey from central Melbourne to Barunah Plains is approximately 1.5 hours by car.

Barunah Plains is located at 4484 Hamilton Hwy, Hesse.

Your route will depend on your starting point however if travelling from Metropolitan Melbourne, we suggest travelling via the West Gate Fwy, then onto Geelong Ring Rd towards Colac and finally, taking the exit onto B140 towards Hamilton.

Doof Sticks

Please have some dancefloor etiquette - no one wants to be stuck behind a giant sign.

We understand doof sticks are a fun and creative way to get involved in festival culture and more importantly, are a great way to locate your friends. However, please keep messaging appropriate and respectful.

Our production elements and stage designs are created by a hard working team of creatives. Please do not ruin the incredible visual elements of Beyond The Valley for festival goers. Furthermore, please show respect to the artists by not obstructing the view of their audience.

Doof sticks that are too big or disrespectful will be confiscated.

Drop Off

There will be a designated drop off area for patrons who are catching Uber's, Taxi's or have arranged their own private transfer. If you are being dropped off at BTV you are not required to purchase a Vehicle Pass. Please follow all signage directing you to the correct gate upon arrival. You must stay in your vehicle until you reach the designated drop off point to reduce cars banking up and for the overall safety of all festival goers!

Dr Dan's

Secluded in an open plain away from the main stages, a multi-sensory experience awaits at Dr Dan's.

Here you'll discover everything from distinctive sets from our favourite locals, to surprise appearances from top-tier talent.

A unique scaffold structure will support a canopy of vibrant red arches. Podiums down either side will create an inviting dance floor space, uniting artists and dancers alike. Elements of the natural environment complimented by bespoke lighting design will see the space transform from day into the night.

While the stage design evolves, the ethos behind Dr Dan's stage remains the same; in loving memory of our legendary friend Dr Dan Christidis, this inclusive space aims to bring together friends new & old, for moments we will never forget.

Ecology Team

Throughout the event you will see our Ecology Team, dressed in green high vis throughout the campgrounds. This team will be handing out bin bags, encouraging tidy campsites and rewarding the cleanest camps with a gift from BTV!

Environment

The beauty of Beyond The Valley extends far beyond the festival site. We are immensely grateful to the communities within the Golden Plains Shire and are humbled to be able to call Barunah Plains home. Attending BTV comes with the responsibility to make a pledge to keep your campsite clean and leave-no-trace.

As a festival we acknowledge that we have a responsibility to educate and empower our community and implement sustainable practices. We hope you will join us in our goal to leave a positive impact on the land and ensure our temporary home is taken care of for years to come.

On the right are some of our top tips to help reduce your carbon footprint for the weekend!

- Carpool: Choosing to carpool has many benefits including shorter wait times on arrival and less emissions being released into the atmosphere due to fewer cars on the road. Save money by splitting the cost of a car pass between friends!
- Recycle: Bins will be conveniently located throughout the festival site. Garbage bags and an info sheet will be provided on arrival - please ensure you dispose of your waste properly and in the correct bin bags.
- Reuse your camping gear: We encourage you to invest in good quality camping gear that can be reused to avoid equipment ending up in landfill at the end of the festival.
- Bring reusable items: A simple and effective way to reduce your carbon footprint at a festival is to ditch single use plastics that would go straight to landfill and instead bring reusable items including a cup, bowl and cutlery.

Exit

Rest assured we have completed work on a number of improvements to make your exit experience much quicker and smoother. These improvements include upgrading the roads surrounding Beyond the Valley and establishing dedicated separate entry and exit routes exclusively for buses, which was one of the reasons for the bottleneck last year.

We have also implemented a new Traffic Management Plan which will see patrons being able to head back to Melbourne via Bannockburn and Winchelsea, in addition to the usual route via Inverleigh. These updates mean 3 Exit Routes on Jan 1st with all 3 routes lead back to Melbourne. They each have a similar travel time and include amenities along the way so you can refresh and recharge.

As with all festivals, there may still be a reasonable wait time on Jan 1st, but we're confident with these improvements you'll be home in no time.

Additionally, there will be food and entertainment on offer until 6pm on the 1st of January, and The Sanctuary and Better Beer Beach Club will be open during the day for those who would like to take time to rest and recharge before heading home!

Please note, we suggest planning ahead for your journey home by ensuring you have enough fuel in your car for the end of the weekend, and refilling your water bottles in case of a hot day.

Fire

Beyond The Valley adheres to a strict NO FIRE POLICY. December/January are in the peak of Australia's high-risk fire season, so it is necessary for us to set a total fire ban across the duration of the event. This means no camp fires, no candles, no camp stoves, no gas lanterns, no naked flames whatsoever.

We all know how dangerous our summers can get, and we want to do everything we can to keep all our patrons and our beautiful landscape protected.

Any breach of the total fire ban policy at BTV will result in immediate ejection from the event.

Ferris Wheel

Jump on the Beyond The Valley Ferris Wheel and admire Barunah Plains in its entirety. Located within the main arena, ascend and be treated to a panoramic view of the festival unfolding below you!

Games of The Valley

Glass

BTV has a strict no glass policy and we must reinforce this due to safety reasons. The following items are banned and will be confiscated if found. There is no guarantee that confiscated items will be returned to you after the festival concludes.

Green My Plate (Reusable Crockery)

A selection of food vendors will be serving up their delicious food on the reusable Green My Plate plates and bowls which you then simply place into the pink bins within the venue.

The team from Green My Plate will be continuously collecting the reusable plates and co to then wash and recirculate, leaving a cleaner footprint, and diverting single-use food packaging from landfill. The process is simple. Simply head to your choice of food vendor, order up, then place your reusable plate in the PINK BIN.

Please note that the crockery cannot be taken back to your campsite.

Info Boards

Look out for the Info Boards - located in the Main Arena and at the campgrounds entrance, the boards will broadcast daily news updates including the weather forecast, important festival information or emergency updates.




