Wisdom

While delivering a broad and balanced curriculum we ensure that all our learning is placed within a distinctive Christian context, enabling students to make sense of the world through a God-centred lens. Our students transition from learning through play in the early years, to leaving the school with a range of qualifications which prepare them well for the next stage of their education.



Favour

The Bible teaches us to love God and our neighbour as ourselves. At The King's School we provide an environment in which students can grow in their relationship with God and develop Christ-like characteristics. Through our assemblies, tutor times and lessons we encourage students to grow in their faith and to form healthy friendships with each other and the wider community.

TEACHING AND LEARNING

Our excellent team of teachers cultivates a nurturing environment to ensure that all children feel secure in their new school. Learning can only happen effectively when children are happy and safe and therefore we do all we can to help them settle quickly and make new friends.



In Reception and Years 1 and 2, many of the activities will be built around extended play, enabling children to have fun while remaining engaged in their learning. Some of the children that join us will already be able to recognise letters, numbers and even words, but whatever the starting point, we will ensure children are challenged appropriately and make good progress.

In Years 3 to 6, learning becomes more structured and pupils are stretched in all areas, both academic and creative, in order to maximise achievement.

Children are encouraged to grow in character, to become confident and resilient, making the most of every opportunity.

Underpinning all of this, children are taught to trust and love God and discover what it means to be His child.

As students progress through the senior years, achievement at every level is encouraged and supported. There is a varied programme of academic and spiritual challenge and opportunities for students to grow in leadership and responsibility.

By understanding more about God, students will see that success lies in placing Him at the centre of everything they do. It is this ingredient alone that gives our students the ability to move on to the next stage of their learning with confidence and maturity.





CHRIST-CENTRED EDUCATION

Teaching children the truth about God and His world is at the centre of Christian education. Although the content of a Christian curriculum is not vastly different from that taught in most schools today, it is the context within which that content is placed that makes the difference. Christian education derives its context and basis from truths and values taught by God through the Bible.

In Primary, each class focuses on a half-termly Heart Concept, a Bible verse or Biblical truth, around which all their other learning is based. Although numeracy and literacy are a key focus, a broad range of other subjects are highly valued, allowing students to discover their own areas of interest and enjoyment. Small class sizes enable us to meet the needs of all students as teachers know each child well, supporting them as individuals in their learning journey.

As our senior students progress through the school, they gain a deepening awareness of God's plans and purposes for their lives. In our secure environment, where achievement at every level is encouraged and supported, students will engage in a structured programme of academic and spiritual challenge.

The school provides a broad and balanced curriculum, offering a wide range of subjects. Students are prepared for up to 11 GCSE subjects drawn from a broad range of disciplines, in order to establish a balanced education and prepare students for further and higher education.

Please Note: Activity Weeks, examination fees and all extra-curricular activities are charged in addition to the above. Students who require a visa to attend the school will be charged an overseas supplement and if any additional curriculum support is required, there will also be an additional charge.

£50 Application Fee: Payable per child upon application of your child - non-refundable.

£1,000 (£500 Siblings) Deposit: Payable per child either six months before your child begins school, or as soon as the application is approved, if this is less than a term before the start date. The deposit is refunded either at the end of Year 11 or when each child leaves, providing all fees due have been paid.



EXAMINATION RESULTS 2021 - TEACHER ASSESSED GRADES

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

- Receive Prospectus / Attend an Open Day
- Meet with the Headteacher *and SENCo, if appropriate
- Taster Days; Pre-school students may be visited in their current setting
- Submit Application Form and £50 fee
- Discussions with previous school to ensure that The King's School is the best place for your child
- Church references are taken
- Further taster days as required
- Notify parents of panel's decision. If successful: payment of deposit
- Completion of admissions paperwork
- If starting in September, attend transfer day in July
- Start School
