

T IS A REAL LUXURY TO BE ABLE TO create from scratch a house that works seamlessly with its surroundings. This stunning house, on the edge of the South Downs, is a case in point. A labour of love for its owners - it took more than four-and-a-half years to complete - it offers the perfect blend of old and new, natural and man-made.

Its stunning contemporary rooms - each featuring stone

flooring by Artisans of Devizes - are filled with natural light and antiques that have made their way into the family's collection over the years.

As soon as you step through the front door you realise just how special this house is - a natural stream runs from the front door through the centre of the house and out the back.

"When the builders began excavating," the homeowner says,

"there was so much ambient water that the foundations filled up and they had to find a way to channel it out of the way. Rather than create an enclosed pipe, we chose to allow it to run under the house and make a feature of it by covering it with glass. It looks beautiful and creates such a lovely sound."

When the family moved in the garden hadn't been completed and they had also not yet chosen shading options.

It wasn't until the family moved in that they realised they needed blinds. The orangery in particular was fearsomely hot and the sunlight began to damage fabrics.

"You wouldn't think a modern house would suffer from extremes, but the glass seemed to trap the heat when it was sunny and then let in the cold in the winter months.

"We had a wood-burning stove for colder weather, but it was difficult in the summer. I'm not a great advocate of air-conditioning as I don't like the effect it has on the skin. But somehow we needed to make it a livable room and that's where the blinds came in.

"We chose French Pinoleum for the drawing room, orangery and the roof lantern in the hall. We like the fact that you can see though it, so the views aren't spoiled and, when you are sitting outside, you can still see in.

"French Pinoleum also has a 🔿







beautiful softness to it. It's not so modern that it is harshly stark; instead it has real texture and when you look back in from the garden it creates a beautiful, slightly ethereal effect in the room, bathing it in dappled light. We liked it so much we chose to place a statue in a certain position as it is the perfect piece to take advantage of this effect."

The orangery provides the only eating area in the house, so it was hugely important that it was a comfortable room to be in.

"The blinds made all the difference," the homeowner says. "We eat in there every day and it's where we entertain. Now the temperature is perfectly comfortable and the room is a joy to use.

"We use the blinds in each of the different areas everyday. We mainly leave them closed over the roof lantern. In the drawing room, I tend to close them halfway through the day and open them again in the morning. In the orangery, I move them around depending on the position of the sun. It's all very easy as they are motorised."

It was important to the family to have blinds that worked perfectly with the colour scheme in the various rooms and they opted to have the French Pinoleum blinds finished in Farmhouse Door with natural braid. This gives each room a clean, pulledtogether look which sets off the interior design perfectly.

"We're very happy with both the look and performance of the blinds," the homeowner says. "Grants were really good to deal with. They provided a great service and were extremely helpful."

[The blinds have made] the temperature perfectly comfortable. Each room is a joy to use.





Space in which to work out or relax


HEN JOHN AND KATY moved into the Surrey house they share with their three children, they knew they wanted to make some significant improvements and, importantly, add to the space. Their chosen solution was to the building of two orangeries by Glass Houses by Jeremy Uglow.

The family – all of whom are passionate about fitness – decided to use one of the orangeries to house a home gym and the other, which is just off the kitchen, was designed as a family room where they could eat, relax and entertain friends.

They realised early on that the success of these rooms would depend on the right shading. After discussions with their Grants project manager, they opted for motorised pleated roof blinds – which they had fitted within the existing glazing bars – and chose the Ascot material in No7 Pale Palette. The material has a Solar Reflective pearlised backing that increases the effectiveness of the blinds in reducing heat without cutting out too much light. It also cuts out nearly all UV fading, which is important for protecting the materials

The blinds in the gym have proved incredibly important.





open, but will often close them in the afternoon."

John and Katy opted for shutters from Grants as a perfect solution for a dressing room and guest bedroom.

"These are spaces that require privacy, but the blinds we initially had let in very little light, causing the rooms to feel a bit gloomy. The shutters we now have are great as they don't block

the light, but do offer privacy, particularly in the guest bedroom, which overlooks the front garden. Grants have been brilliant to deal with and they have been incredibly patient with me. I'm very fussy about details and I have tested their patience to the limit, but they were brilliant. They happily went through every detail and definitely went the extra mile."

Country cottage chic



HEN YVONNE AND KEVIN moved into their period property they wanted to create more space while being sympathetic to living in a rural building with history. They called in Quayside Conservatories, who came up with a solution that worked perfectly for their

"My husband was really keen on creating an extra room," says Yvonne, "as our main living room is upstairs and he wanted somewhere we could sit and relax without having to climb the stairs.

"It's straight off the kitchen and we love sitting in there after lunch and before dinner. We sit with our feet up and finish the crossword. It's one of the great benefits of being retired."

The couple chose French Pinoleum blinds from Grants, fitted within the glazing bars on the roof and inside the recesses on the windows and to the face of the doors at the front. They opted for a flatweave finish in Grant's Old Hardwick colour with a natural colour braid.

"We really liked the French Pinoleum blinds as they look beautiful and you can see they will be hardwearing and will last a long time. We looked at pleated blinds, but felt they would be a little stark for a conservatory such as ours.

"We wanted something that looked right in the setting and which felt natural as we have natural brick and flint in the room and the walls are painted in a neutral, architectural colour. We didn't want something bold that stood out; instead we were looking for something that blended perfectly with all that was already there."

The couple wanted to ensure the room was usable all year round, which was



why they felt strongly that they needed to choose exactly the right blinds.

"This was our first summer and we found they made a huge difference. They keep the conservatory cool and, as we had so much sunshine this year, that was really important; it would have been unbearable. In the winter, too, they make the room feel much cosier.


"We use the conservatory all year round in pretty much the same way and if I am away, my husband doesn't bother to go upstairs to the other sitting room at all - he simply stays in the conservatory.

Make a fresh start

Replacing blinds that are past their best can be a cost-effective way of breathing new life into an older conservatory...

EVAMPING A CONSERVATORY or orangery can give it a completely new lease of life and is considerably more cost effective than starting again from scratch.

This conservatory is a case in point. It was cleaned up and repainted and, with Grants recommended by the homeowners' interior designers - Dodge Interiors of Shaftesbury, the old blinds were replaced. The 10-year-old Amdega conservatory now looks as good as if it were built last week.

The roof and window blinds from Grants are wideweave French Pinoleum custom-painted to match the walls. The braid is in a natural colourway.

The new blinds are fully motorised on the roof, making them easy to operate. They were made using Grants' wideweave material, which has been custom-painted to match exactly the conservatory and also the walls, which were painted in the same bespoke colour.

Choosing to match the colour of the blinds with the walls gives the room a unified feel and, without fail, French Pinoleum adds a real feeling of laid-back luxury wherever it is used.



Flexibility and comfort

This intimate conservatory was too hot in the summer and too cold in the winter until the roof and window blinds from Grants transformed it into a comfortable living space that could be enjoyed all year round...

CONSERVATORY PROVED the perfect answer when this homeowner was looking for a way to turn dead space into two delightful and usable rooms.

"There was an old stone shed that was really only used as a junk room," she says. "The conservatory allowed me to link the main house to the shed, which in turn was made into an office. I actually did all the pointing myself and then had a conservatory company do the glass work."

That was 18 months ago and the householder was thrilled with he results, but found the conservatory was difficult to live in – too cold in the winter and far too hot in the summer.

"I will definitely be using it all year round now," she adds, "as the blinds make it really comfortable to be in."

She chose pleated window blinds from Grants in Cheltenham material and opted for them to be manual cord tensioned and fitted within the glazing bars. For the roof blinds, she went for French Pinoleum flatweave blinds. Each is painted in Haddon Hall, which was chosen to match the natural stone colour of the building.

"When I'm at work, I close all the blinds so the conservatory stays cool for when I get home", she says. "I chose pleated window blinds for the way they fit into the window beading and open with the tilt-turn windows and doors [inset picture, right].

"When I'm at work they're all closed and shaded so it stays cool and then it varies in the summer – up and down to let the light in.

"I use the conservatory as a second living room, so it needs to be a nice place to relax. Before I had the blinds installed I felt as if I were in a goldfish bowl, as it is overlooked. Now the blinds have given me some privacy, which is great.

"Grants were very good to deal with and the products are great. I saw a number of companies, but I liked Grants best as the salesman was really helpful and not at all pushy. They got everything done on time, which was brilliant."





CASE STUDY # 6

State-of-the-art shading in the heart of London

Grants joined forces with the architects and the main building contractors to transform an ageing building in London's Tottenham Court Road into high-art office facilities...

HE SITE FOR THIS PROJECT was an old building in London's Tottenham Court Road, where the street façade was to be retained but everything else behind would be replaced to provide modern office facilities.

Among the key elements were additional floors which were added and set back with a large curved glazing area supported on timber glulam beams bringing state-of-the-art design to a period property that had seen better days.

Grants were approached by highly respected architects Collado Collins and the national building contractors, Costain, who had been let down midway through the project by their existing suppliers who were unable to supply shading that worked within the originally agreed budget.

Having surveyed the project and discussed every aspect of it with the architect, Grants' Special Projects Division suggested a bespoke shading solution specifically designed to follow the main curve of the glazing and stack at the head when not required.

The proposals put forward by Grants were based on a fully motorised Endurashade system operating through parallel side channels with the motor itself housed at the head of the blind.

The order was placed by Costain subject to approval of a working prototype crafted at Grants' Isle of Wight workshops. When this full-sized prototype was indeed signed off, the blinds – manufactured using Blenheim 7215 Charcoal material and supported by a steel hardware system finished to match the colour of the overall glazing structure – were commissioned and installed by Grants' project management team. Finally – to ensure the highest levels of aftersales care – an ongoing service contract was put in place for the tenant to ensure the blinds were regularly maintained and kept in good working order.









Shading with architectural credentials

When developers completed their complex plans to convert two 1960s flats into one luxury penthouse apartment, they turned to Grants to provide **bespoke shading** for a series of complicated glass features...

HIS PROJECT SAW GRANTS involved in the extensive conversion of two adjacent 1960s top floor flats in separate buildings to create a single luxury penthouse apartment. Key to the project was the addition of an extra floor to both buildings, with these to be surrounded with inclined and horizontal glazing and with a glass walkway linking the two new areas.

The use of so much glass created an architecturally stunning space, but it meant that a comprehensive shading system would be required to ensure the apartments would be useable on a day-to-day basis.

The initial design constraints dictated that the blinds had be a single unit which would cover the inclined glazing and then – by changing direction – the short areas of horizontal of glazing too.

The mounting structure of both the glazing and all fittings and fixtures was required to be stainless steel. The specified blinds would also be required to be housed behind curved plaster forms fitted throughout the glazed areas to conceal the blinds were not required

Grants' Special Projects Division proposed a roller blind benefiting from twin rollers which would house both the motor and the drive. The fabric would be cut to fit in with the complex angle shapes for the corner windows. They would run over a rotating roller bar which would support the fabric from the incline to the horizontal.

Importantly, Grants was involved from the first stages in what was to be an architecturally challenging project. Quotations were provided to agreed client specifications and accepted during the earliest consultations, enabling Grants to ensure the completed shading elements integrated perfectly within the finished design scheme.

In addition to the standard fixed glazing, the new penthouse apartment would feature a number of gullwing opening windows and blinds which complimented the entire scheme were also to be installed on these.

The blinds themselves were crafted Sandringham Papyrus colour, a high-performance material which features a solar reflective backing to ensure the maximum light reflection and heat retention.

Motorisation puts you in control

Controlling light and shade can be made easier with fully automated motorised blinds. In this delightful drawing room, every single blind can be raised or lowered using a discrete wall-mounted control panel...



HE WINDOWS IN THIS delightfully welcoming drawing room look on to classically landscaped gardens, providing a wonderful link with the natural world outside. Situated on the island of Jersey, however, the house also often finds itself bathed in sunshine and without blinds the room could be uncomfortably warm.

Achieving the ideal balance between light and shade is made easier, however, because every blind in this room can be operated remotely at the flick of a switch. The room benefits from a fully integrated automation system which can be controlled either by a hand-held remote control or via a convenient wall-mounted computer panel. The system even allows control via a mobile phone which can be operated from almost anywhere in the world.

Simple settings make it possible to fully retract all or any of the blinds, to fully close them or to stop them at any point in the window's overall depth. This level of control means any blind can always be in the optimum position either to maximise light entering the room or to provide accurate levels of shading.

The motorised blinds – shown here in Holland Cream – also retract behind a curtain pelmet so as to be completely out of view when not required. The system installed in this property takes automation a step further. Alongside controlling the blind settings, the control panel is, in turn, able to control the lighting levels, the heating in the room and music which can be played throughout the house.

The homeowner says: "When building a new house from scratch, you can make it as user-friendly as possible and there is no need to compromise on any aspect. That's why we chose to install an AV system, which allows us to control many elements of the room from a simple control panel on the wall.

"Not only can we adjust the lighting to exactly the right level and choose which music to play at the touch of a button, but we can also control the blinds.

"This makes perfect sense as the natural light allowed in through the windows and roof lanterns can be co-ordinated to work perfectly with the lighting system, ensuring that it is at exactly the right level.

Made in Britain and crafted to work beautifully

Grants blinds are manufactured in a purpose-built workshop unit on the Isle of Wight. Here, we look at the process for our hugely popular **French Pinoleum blinds** – from taking a customer's order through to delivery and installation...

RANTS has been one of the UK's leading manufacturers of the very highest quality blinds for more than 30 years, first from premises in Winchester and latterly from workshops on the Isle of Wight. The company prides itself on the highest levels of customer care, offering market-leading guarantees and with each order handled personally by a dedicated project manager. While the process is exacting and detailed to ensure every element of every order fits perfectly within a customer's specifications, Grants is also able to respond quickly and efficiently because it manufactures almost every blind itself by hand, meaning it does not have to rely on third party companies to meet delivery dates.

Handmade by skilled craftsmen

The process for French Pinoleum blinds begins with a run-through of the customer's precise requirements, which always follows a survey from one of the company's fully trained surveyors. Once these are agreed, detailed plans are drawn up with a worksheet containing every one of the complicated calculations needed to make up the blinds.


The first step is the preparation of the guide rails, with each cut, drilled and prepared for assembly. Next, the customer's material is trimmed to the approximate size and shape before being custompainted and then cut to precisely the correct dimensions and shape.

Next, the chosen braiding – which can even be made up from material supplied by the customer or their interior designer or architect – is sewn on by hand with solar reflective backing added if this option has been specified. The blind material is then added to the pre-cut rails and the wires or cords needed for either manual or motorised adjustment are connected before the completed blinds are quality checked and tested. Finally, the customer's order is then packed and shipped to the installer for fitting.





Straightforward to install, it requires fewer support wires and, as a semi-rigid material, it is ideal for roof blinds. French pinoleum from Grants also features matching or complementary braided edges to further help protect the French Pinoleum material.



Pleated blinds

SOMETIMES LESS IS MORE and it isn't about standing out, but about blending in and this is where pleated blinds score so highly. They provide excellent shading, while maintaining a low profile through their discrete appearance. Lovely to look at and brilliantly practical. they bring real modernity to a conservatory, orangery or glass room and Grants have a wealth of experience in designing and installing Pleated blinds for complex roof shapes. A neat 20mm rail system can be fitted within window beading close to the glass and this style of blind is out of sight when not in use. With more than 200 options available in a wide range of colourways, Pleated blinds are great for doors and windows which are often opened and with a vast array of options, there really is a pleated blind to suit every style of room, door and window. They can be made to be top stack, bottom stack, floating stack or as a day/night blind configuration. The blinds shown can benefit from manual cord tension technology - with no loose cords - and are available in voile, semi-transparent, opaque and blackout material choices.

Blinds can be operated individually or in groups and Grants' motorised products are so easy to use, allowing everyone – from the youngest child to those with mobility problems - to operate the blinds themselves.

Most home installations use a low-voltage, 24-volt supply which is safe and easy to install. Transformers will need to be housed nearby, ideally within a cupboard or in an adiacent room.

Wiring diagrams specific to each project are provided where required, especially when wiring is to be totally concealed during construction.

Grants is with you every step of the way. Our clients usually take responsibility for providing the mains power source (via a fused spur) to the transformer position. We do the rest.

Grants' motorised system are supplied as 'stand alone' units, but can also be integrated into advanced home audiovisual automation systems.






