HOTBHN services have expanded to include:

Outpatient Substance Use Services for adult clients who need substance use treatment funded by the Texas Health and Human Services Commission.

These services are provided in addition to other services offered by HOTBHN and can include anyone in our community who is struggling with a substance use disorder.

Services to be provided will be determined with an initial screening to establish appropriateness for treatment.

The assessment done at the initial appointment will determine the length of the services provided. Most services will be from six to sixteen weeks, as determined by the assessment and treatment team.

Co-occurring disorders are addressed and treated in an outpatient setting.

Outpatient counseling services that include therapy can be provided for clients and family members who have a need outside of substance use or mental health case management.

Other priority populations include:

- 1. Individuals at high risk for overdose
- 2. Individuals referred by DFPS
- Individuals experiencing housing instability or homelessness
- 4. All other populations

Outpatient and mental health services are available to anyone in our community suffering from a substance use disorder.

We accept referrals from all sources, including state agencies such as CPS, Veterans, Probation, Parole, Drug Court, or private referral.
