## Going Deeper

Matilda knew being little didn't mean she couldn't do a lot, she knew she could do things. In the Bible, Paul reminds Timothy (1 Timothy, chapter 4, verse 12 (ICB)) "You are young, but do not let anyone treat you as if you were not important...". How does the world look down on children? What are some of the things that kids have done that are amazing?



VVe are miracles. Read Psalm 139, verses 13 - 18). What does this Psalm tell us about how God sees us? How does this help us to reframe the negative ideas we get from ourselves and others?

Read Isaiah, chapter 1, verse 17. The Bible tells us to stand up for others. We see Matilda do this (watch at 44m and 1h 31m for examples). Where are the opportunities for us to stand up and make a difference?
