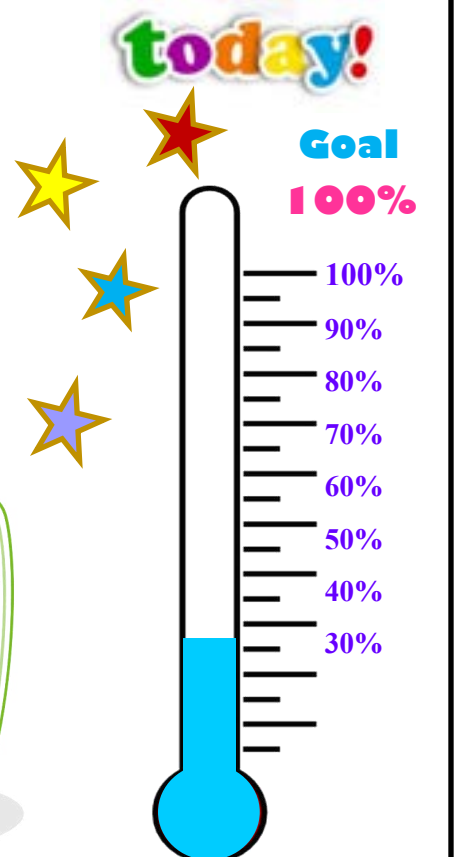

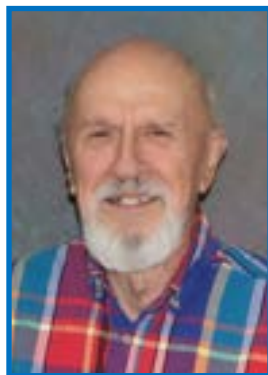

**Norris Randall**

Norris was born in Columbus, Georgia, on Norris Road in 1932, in a house that is still standing. With the exception of one year in Birmingham, Alabama, Norris received his elementary education in Columbus. He attended Columbus High School in the 8th grade before moving to Atlanta where he attended Lithonia High School before graduating from Stone Mountain High School. While at Stone Mountain, he met Sarah Janet Cox who Norris dated through the 11th and 12th grades. After graduation, Janet earned her RN Degree from Emory University while Norris earned his BS degree in Industrial Engineering from Clemson University. Norris also received his Commission as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Army from Clemson University. While serving his country at Fort Knox Kentucky, he and Janet were married at the Stone Mountain Methodist Church in 1954 and from 1955 until 1961, they had 4 beautiful children. After two years of military service, Norris and Janet moved to Phenix City, Alabama, where he began his ceramic tile business. In 2002, Janet had surgery and was told she might live for 2 years. Norris said they were actually blessed with 10 additional years before her passing in 2013. Six years later, as Norris continued to live life, he was blessed in marrying his current wife, Linda. They were married by his son, a Methodist minister. After deciding one house was too small, the other house was too big, they actually received yet another blessing by moving to Spring Harbor. Norris and Linda participate in many activities at Spring Harbor. Norris currently serves as the Co-Chair on the Building, Maintenance and Security Forum. An interesting memory: One of Norris's most vivid memories occurred while he was attending the Bradley Theater in Columbus on December 7th, 1941, when there was an announcement for all military personnel to report to their units. Three young soldiers jumped to their feet and immediately left the theater. Norris says he often wonders when he sees pictures of military cemeteries if those three soldiers that jumped to their feet that day are in those pictures.



**Rex Whiddon**

Rex, born in Tifton, Georgia, obtained his undergraduate and graduate degrees in Piano Performance from the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York, where he and his late wife, Lynn, a violin performance major, met. They had three wonderful children (Caroline, Julie, and Matt), and six grandchildren. Rex and Lynn celebrated their fiftieth wedding anniversary prior to Lynn's passing in 2018. They moved to Columbus, Georgia, in 1970 when he accepted the position of Artist Teacher of Piano at what was then Columbus College. Lynn became Associate Concertmaster of the Columbus Symphony, taught private violin lessons, and went back to school and obtained her Master of Music Education from the Schwob School of Music at CSU. She is perhaps best remembered as founder of the Youth Orchestra of Greater Columbus which celebrates its thirtieth season this year. In 1981, Rex was appointed Director of the

Schwob School of Music, developing it into one of the top music schools in the country. Following his retirement in 1999 as Director of the Schwob School, he accepted the position of Director of Major Gifts for the CSU Foundation. He currently serves as the Senior Associate Vice President for Leadership Philanthropy and Strategic Initiatives. He served as the Organist for First Baptist Church in Columbus for 28 years and in recent years, he has been heavily involved at First Presbyterian Church of Columbus, where he has served as an Elder, past Chairman Board of Deacons, and past Chair of the Stewardship and Finance Ministry. He has also served on the Historic Columbus Foundation Board and as past President of the Music Teachers National Association (1997-1999). Rex saw first-hand the great experience his father had in our Independent Living area, and the wonderful care he received once he had to move to our Skilled Care Community. Following Lynn's death, Rex enjoyed his condo on the river for a "season" but after a couple of years he decided to return to Spring Harbor. He and his King Charles Cavalier, Sassy, live in Villa 13. Rex currently serves on the Resident Council and is Co-Chair of the Spring Harbor Foundation Board.

## McDougall's Message

### Survey Time

In the last 45 days we have been in survey mode as an organization. In this article I would like to explain just a little of the process so you all understand how Spring Harbor is surveyed. Our second floor on the Health Center is what is called by licensure a Skilled Nursing Facility. Each year a Skilled Nursing Facility is surveyed by the state to evaluate if the facility is in compliance or noncompliance with the regulations from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS). This is a recertification done each year by state surveyors and is subject for the approval of CMS. These surveys are not announced and they are able to survey any organization when they see fit to include weekends and all hours of the day. During the survey process if they find things out of compliance with a certain regulation they are able to issue tags or citations. Once the survey is complete an exit interview is done and within 10 days they send you the full report so that you can see where there were opportunities. The organization must then send a plan of correction to address any citations received. I am happy to report that the surveys have gone well and there were only a few citations delivered to Spring Harbor. One surveyor told us we should be extremely pleased and that we are in the top 1% of surveys across the country. This time of year, can be very stressful for our Health Center employees and leadership, but I could not be prouder of them during the survey process. There is always room for improvement and these surveys only help us improve for the future. Starting July 1, 2023 there were new initiatives put in place to better assist us with staffing on the Health Center and process development. As I mentioned, it is survey time. Just as state surveyors gave us feedback so that we can grow to serve each of you better as an organization, you will now have that chance to provide feedback as well. Whether good, bad or indifferent we ask that you help us to improve. This is our chance to understand where our residents are in regard to satisfaction with different things such as leadership, dining, amenities, wellness programs and our community as a whole. We are excited as an organization to make this year the best yet. I thank you for all you do to support Spring Harbor as your home.

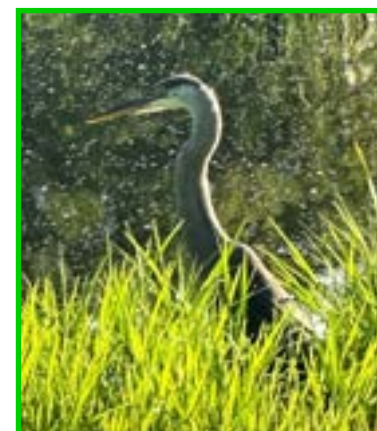
