These workshops bring meaningful topics to life, from effective leadership and community connection to racial, environmental, educational and economic justice, and deliver universal outcomes like:

- Stronger relationships through teamwork
- Increased empathy and respect for different viewpoints
- Passion for exploring root causes of systemic problems
- Tools for transforming and resolving conflict

And with our large-scale events like the Gandhi-King Youth Conference, Youth Ignite, and YOUnified, 4,888 total youth experienced Bridge Builders CONNECT in the 2016-17 school year.

In its 29th season, our yearlong legacy program brought together 1,206 diverse 7th-12th grade students from across the Mid-South.

COLLABORATE starts with a five-day immersive summer conference and continues through the school year with six trainings, community actions, and electives.

All activities are built around an experiential learning cycle: hands-on challenges followed by debriefings that allow students to reflect on what they just did, what they learned, and how they can apply these lessons to their lives.

COLLABORATE yields an enriching, thought-provoking experience that students themselves often refer to as "life-changing."

Situated on the forefront of the global youth-led social change movement, CHANGE is Bridge Builders at its most intense. CHANGE Fellows research, plan and execute strategies to improve the lives of all Memphis youth by organizing other young people and influencing leaders and policy.

In its sixth year, the CHANGE program level included 29 student organizers in five cohorts: The Memphis Youth Union (advancing youth voice in civic decision making), Youth and Police Relations, Gender and Sexuality Equality, Educational Justice (advocating for restorative justice policies in schools), and Memphis Against Sexual Harassment and Assault.

In the summer of 2017, current CHANGErs, alumni, and staff worked together to develop a comprehensive strategic plan for program growth over the next 3-5 years.

Incarcerated Youth
Speaking Out for Change

We believe in the leadership capacity of all youth, and that includes those who've had contact with the justice system.

In 2015, our CHANGE Fellows' research into juvenile justice and school discipline policies led BRIDGES leadership to establish a new joint venture with the Shelby County Sheriff's Office. What initially began as a stand-alone workshop quickly expanded into formalized Bridge Builders programming for youth inside the Shelby County Jail system.

BRIDGES' 2017 IYSOC cohort included seven youth, who received leadership training in public speaking, conflict resolution, and effective change models, as well as Alternatives to Violence Project facilitator certification.

IYSOC members mentor other youth inside the jail system, travel for speaking engagements, and draw upon their own experiences with crime and violence to create practical recommendations for reducing youth recidivism and dismantling the school-to-prison pipeline.


