
#### FILLING OUT THE NEW FAFSA WEBINAR COMING NEXT WEEK

There's still time to register for the "Filling Out the New FAFSA" webinar scheduled for Tuesday, Feb. 20 at 6 p.m. (ET). The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) has been updated for 2024 and is now live. Submitting the FAFSA can open students up to valuable grants, scholarships, loans, and work-study jobs, if they qualify.

Those who attend will learn what documents they'll need before they start filling out the FAFSA, how to get their Federal Student Aid (FSA) ID; which parent to include on their form, qualifications for receiving federal financial aid; what to expect after submitting the FAFSA; information about Pell Grants and other financial aid that never has to be paid back, and much more.

The FAFSA is a great way to make college more affordable. This online event is hosted by financial aid experts who will teach students – step by step – how to correctly fill out the FAFSA.

#### AFTER ROCKY LAUNCH, FAFSA IS NOW AVAILABLE FULL-TIME

"After a rocky launch, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is officially operating like normal. The new form changed substantially through a congressionally mandated simplification process and will be "continuously available except for routine maintenance, typical of any FAFSA cycle." Following a soft launch, the form was unavailable to students most of its first days and was offline for many hours each day, prompting a plethora of complaints from parents and counselors. ## REPORT: FOUR WAYS TO PROMOTE RURAL COLLEGE STUDENT ENROLLMENT AND COMPLETION

"Twenty-nine percent of adults 18 to 24 years old in rural areas are enrolled in higher education, 19 percentage points lower than their urban counterparts. Rural students face additional challenges like reliable transportation, food and housing insecurity, and access to high-speed internet and healthcare. Challenges for rural students interested in pursuing a college degree include affordability, college-readiness programs, college recruitment, long distances from colleges, and negative perceptions about the value of college..." #### WHAT'S IN THE AI LITERACY ACT, AND HOW WILL IT IMPACT YOU?

"Federal lawmakers are taking steps to ensure equitable access to learning and using Al. Representatives introduced the bipartisan artificial intelligence (Al) Literacy Act that aims to classify Al as a necessary part of digital literacy and make it accessible via public schools, colleges, universities, and libraries. The first part will amend the Digital Equity Act of 2021 which defines digital literacy and identifies areas that need to be addressed to close the digital divide. After Al is established as something that everyone should be equitably educated about, it will focus on five main areas: skills, competition, education, equity, and accountability. # SCAFFOLDING VIRTUAL SIMULATIONS IN HIGHER EDUCATION FOR CAREER-READINESS

"While budgets are being tightened across the country as enrollment struggles to return to pre-pandemic levels, IT departments continue to grow as hybrid work and instruction become entrenched in college life. A straightforward way to limit spending is through technology standardization. #### **■ GETTING YOUR HIGHER EDUCATION INFRASTRUCTURE AI-READY**

"Al has found its way into research in biochemistry, meteorology, pharmacology, and other research areas. There has been a lot of thinking and talking about Al in higher education, but little has been done about it. Colleges will need to invest in computing upgrades to have a certain Al footprint in the future. They will need more bandwidth and lower latency on their networks to ensure Al tools generate the outcomes they want. Along with this, Al tools will have a large pool of data to analyze and generate their own data..." (Source: EdTech Magazine)

#### ■ THE FUTURE OF STUDENT-CENTERED LEARNING

"Two of the co-authors of the most recent Horizon report from EDUCAUSE say two key themes that emerged this year were flexibility and student-centered learning. Students are asking if institutions provide the flexibility they need, and new technologies like AI are reinforcing the need to design teaching and learning around the student experience. Flexibility and centering students helps colleges and universities move closer to making education equitable for all students, say Kathe Pelletier, Director, Teaching and Learning Program at EDUCAUSE, and Jenay Robert, Senior Researcher at EDUCAUSE. ### EMPOWERING ONLINE INSTRUCTORS: A GUIDE TO CRISIS PREVENTION AND PREPAREDNESS

"Online learning is one of the most prevalent modalities in higher education today, but the rapid expansion of online learning means that many institutions overlooked campus safety procedures for faculty teaching online from remote locations. Faculty should be trained on crisis prevention and intervention, signs of distress in an online environment, and how to engage with students experiencing emotional distress. #### **STUDENTS DISTANCING FROM DISTANCE LEARNING**

"New enrollment data shows that the number of students participating in online learning is declining. In the 2022-2023 academic year, 53 percent were enrolled in at least one online course, decreasing from 2021's fall enrollment of 59 percent of students in an online course. The decline was not unexpected given the surge of remote learning during the COVID-19 pandemic. Online enrollment will likely never return to pre-pandemic numbers. Does online learning continue to be popular at your institution?" (Source: Inside Higher Ed)

#### BIDEN ADMINISTRATION LOOKS TO CLAMP DOWN ON INCLUSIVE ACCESS

"The Biden administration seeks to roll back an Obama-era policy that allowed a procurement model for digital textbooks and course materials to flourish. This move alarms publishers and institutions, but student advocates believe it would give students more choices. Nearly half of all degree-granting institutions offer some sort of inclusive or equitable access to textbooks. The Education Department wants to take away colleges' ability to automatically bill students for their books and supplies and have students opt in instead.
