Karim Sadjadpour regularly advises senior U.S., European, and Asian officials, has testified numerous times before the U.S. Congress, and is an advisor to the Aspen Institute's Congressional Program on the Middle East. He has lectured at Harvard, Princeton, and Stanford universities, and has been the recipient of numerous academic awards, including a Fulbright scholarship. He is currently writing a book on radicalism scheduled to be published by Random House/Knopf.

Karim has degrees from the University of Michigan and the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS). He was previously an analyst with the International Crisis Group, based in Tehran and Washington. He has lived in both Iran and the Arab world and speaks Persian, Italian, Spanish, and proficient Arabic. He is an adjunct professor at Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service, teaching a class on U.S. foreign policy and the Middle East.
