






Biography

Putting Artificial Intelligence to Work

Jamie provides unique insights into the challenges and benefits of putting artificial intelligence to work to transform healthcare. Non-profit research

A MIT educated mechanical engineer, Jamie entered the field of translational medicine in 1998 when his brother, Stephen, was diagnosed with ALS (Lou Gehrig's disease) at the age of 29. He founded ALS Therapy Development Institute (ALS TDI), the world's first non-profit biotechnology company.

ALS TDI has been one of the most promising and innovative research organizations involved in the study and treatment of ALS. The Institute was a pioneer in modern disease research as the first organization to run an open research program, posting the results of its studies in real time.

Jamie's work has been the subject of *His Brother's Keeper*, a book by Pulitzer Prize-winning author Jonathan Weiner, and *So Much So Fast*, a Sundance award-winning documentary. He has also been profiled in *The New Yorker* and *on 60 Minutes*.
