Questions to Ask Your Healthcare Team

Use this resource as a guide for a discussion with your health care team. Be sure to bring a pen and print multiple copies for other members of your caregiver team that may be joining you for the appointment so that they can take notes as well.	How will I know if the experimental drug is working for me?
