ARTS ACCESSIBILITY FOR EVERYONE

Board Member Brian Whitfield hopes to help raise Lansing Art Gallery & Education Center's visibility for those who aren't as engaged with its work. "I wish people knew how much the Lansing Art Gallery has to offer," Whitfield said. "There are so many events and activities open to everyone, and I wish, especially, that teens 13 to 17 in the minority communities would get involved."

Whitfield said the recent shift toward large-scale public art, particularly centered around the Black Lives Matter movement, is fascinating and important. "When we think about art, we think about things on walls, but suddenly, we're seeing people painting giant letters and art on the streets," he said. "And then you see things like the little girl in Washington, D.C., who was filmed doing a rollerblading performance on the Black Lives Matter street mural, and you see the combination of art and activism. It was so beautiful."

Whitfield said Lansing Art Gallery & Education Center plays a key role in elevating public art into these crucial conversations through ARTpath and other community efforts. "It's important for the entire community to see the value in the Lansing Art Gallery & Education Center and to trust that it's interested in making the arts accessible for everyone."



STUDENT EXHIBITS

Art Scholarship Alert (ASA) and the Ingham County Student Art Exhibit offer students accolades and awards. These juried art experiences give families a personal experience within our professional art setting. In 2020, ASA was virtual for the first time ever, with 173 applicants, and 73 exhibiting artists.



DEDICATED TO THE ARTS IN MICHIGAN

Over the past two fiscal years, Executive Director Barb Whitney, and in turn the team at Lansing Art Gallery & Education Center, supported the Arts & Creative Education Integration for Student Excellence (ACEISE) project. Funded in part by the National Endowment for the Arts, ACEISE was designed to ensure that the 47,000 students in the Washtenaw Intermediate School District have equitable access to creative education.

Barb supported ongoing efforts by the Arts Alliance and the Washtenaw Intermediate School District to develop strong organizational connections between schools, superintendents, administrators, principals, teachers, arts and creative education providers, teaching artists and community leaders. Her role included research, development of long-range plans and evaluation with a professional development component for arts education providers.

THE ELIZABETH CHARLES FUND

Norm Charles and Phyllis Mellon established the Elizabeth Charles Emerging Artist Grant in Charles' daughter's memory to support Michigan-based emerging visual artists. The scholarship emphasizes awarding artists whose work emphasizes enhancing awareness and equity across race, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity or ethnicity, "It's a permanent fund that will award a scholarship every year," Charles said, "It's nice to see that friends have added to it as well."

Charles said he's grateful the Lansing Art Gallery & Education Center is exposing people of all ages to a wide variety of visual arts. "When I started supporting the gallery about 30 years ago, it was a nice place for artists to hang their art and get recognition and support. It's grown over the years and, more importantly, grown into a significant arts education center. I've been so impressed."
