We applaud our hardworking staff, dedicated volunteers, and generous supporters who make this work possible. And we welcome the arrival of 2024, a year full of promise that we'll break all the records we just set *and* find a home for ARMANI!

While we're celebrating, we wish **RUBY** a very happy adoption day. The sweet ginger is one of 44 senior cats adopted from Pet Pride last year. Brandi and Jeff Pasnik had never adopted a senior before, but with an older dog and cat at home already, they knew a kitten wouldn't be a good fit for their family. "As soon as we saw each other, she just leaned into me and started purring," Brandi said. "We knew immediately that we wanted to take her home." Brandi describes **RUBY** as a very spry and youthful thirteen-year-old who comes running as soon as she spots a ribbon toy or hears someone get the laser pointer out. She added, "We've known her for less than two weeks and love her so much already."

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Pet Pride of New York saves the lives of homeless cats in our community by providing shelter, veterinary care, and adoption into loving homes. We are a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization and a New York State Registered Shelter/ Rescue, and we operate a no-kill cat sanctuary and adoption center.

Dear Friends,

"I don't know how many different ways we can find to say the same thing—please give us money," a fellow board member said recently. Well, I have 834 reasons to ask for your help. Each of these reasons has a name and a story: CHEDDAR, found abandoned and malnourished, living on the city streets, is now safe and well-fed at Pet Pride; CHARMELLA, rescued just as she was about to give birth outdoors in the cold, is raising her six kittens in a Pet Pride foster home; and MARY, a lovingly surrendered senior cat initially confused by her owner's move to a nursing home now confidently roams the hallways here while she waits for her forever home. (See MARY on page three.) Thanks to your contributions in 2023, 834 cats and kittens were spared from another cold Rochester night or an uncertain future.

Your contributions throughout 2023 helped fund hundreds of surgeries and other medical procedures performed right here at Pet Pride in our Healing Paws Medical Center. These included the majority of our spay and neuter surgeries as well as corrective eye surgeries and hernia repair. Your support enabled us to provide expensive but urgently needed dental care for dozens of cats. Until now, we have had to take our cats to local veterinary offices for dental care. Thanks to a generous gift from a donor who wished to help us equip our surgical area, as well as a grant for the same purpose from Bailey and Friends, a component of the Golisano Foundation, we will be able to perform those dental procedures right here at Healing Paws beginning this year.

Last year, your dollars also helped pay for food and essential supplies, compensate our hardworking staff, and keep the heat and lights on in our sanctuary and adoption center. Because of you, the 834 cats adopted in 2023 are now safe and loved. I hope that we can count on your continued support in 2024, because I expect that we will have 1500 reasons to ask for it.

Is This an Emergency? by Stuart Gluckman, DVM

Should I take Fluffy to the emergency vet tonight or can this wait until my veterinarian's office opens in the morning? It's a question many cat owners face at one time or another, and the reduced availability of veterinary care in our area, particularly after-hours emergency care, can make the decision more difficult. Learn to evaluate your cat using four simple health parameters and, with a little practice, you should feel confident making the decision.

1. **Mucous membranes** – Raise your cat's lip and look closely at the color of the gums. Healthy gums fall in a range from light to dark pink.

2. **Respiratory rate** – Watch your cat breathe, preferably while at rest. Normal will usually fall somewhere between 20 and 30 respirations per minute.

3. **Heart rate** - Place your hand on the left side of your cat's chest, or allow your ear to rest on your cat's chest, and count the number of "lub dubs" per minute. The normal range is 100-120.

4. **Temperature**- A bit of lube and a bit of practice and I promise this will be easier than you think. Any human oral or rectal thermometer will suffice. Normal values can be as high as 103°.

The most important question to ask yourself when considering each of these parameters is, "What is normal for my cat?" That's why it's a good idea to periodically assess Fluffy when she's well. Become familiar with your own cat's normal, and you can more quickly and accurately assess when he or she is unwell.

After your home exam, you may find several reasons to get in your car and drive to the nearest emergency facility. At the very least, you will have valuable information to give someone to help them determine how urgently your cat needs to be seen.
