



Find Your Way to Goswick

Our James Braid masterpiece, situated along the Northumberland coast approximately halfway between Edinburgh and Newcastle, is a bit off the beaten path. But it's well worth the journey.

If you're arriving via Edinburgh, find your way to the A720 city bypass and take it south toward Berwick-Upon-Tweed. Keep an eye out for the Goswick sign on the left and then turn left onto the narrow access road.


Coming by way of Newcastle upon Tyne? Follow the A1 north for approximately 50 miles. Once you're past Bamburgh, keep an eye out for the Goswick sign on the left and then turn right onto the narrow access road.

Upon arrival, please check in at the professional shop. A member of our staff will provide whatever guidance you might need to make the most of your round.

Goswick is a relaxed club, but we do expect a certain level of decorum. So, for example, please take off your hat when you enter the clubhouse. Please step outside when taking calls. Mobile phones should be in silent mode when used indoors. And dogs are not allowed to accompany you on the course. Most of all, please maintain a brisk pace of play. Our members typically complete 18 holes in around three hours.

If possible, we encourage you to arrive an hour before the start of your round to take full advantage of our facilities. That includes our clubhouse, where you'll find the toilets and locker room as well as our lounge and bar.

Learn About Our Links

We recommend that you take a bit of time before you arrive to familiarise yourself with Goswick Golf Links. For instance, the <u>flyover tour</u> on our website offers a bird's eye view of every hole along with playing tips offered by Golf Operations Manager Paul Terras.

Note that on-course markers are to the front of the green, including the blue 150-yard stakes on each hole. And we employ a colour-coded system where a red flag indicates a front pin position, yellow a middle pin and white a back pin.

We offer a choice of five tees to suit a wide array of skill levels. Our professional staff would be happy to provide a recommendation based on your level of ability.

In addition, printed course guides are available in the pro shop.

If time permits, we invite you to warm up on our spacious practice ground with grass tees, short game area, putting green and Trackman swing studio.

Goswick Golf Links is best experienced on foot. To ease the burden of carrying your clubs, you can hire either a push or electric trolley. Electric-powered buggies are also available for those who need more assistance. We strongly encourage you to reserve these amenities well in advance to avoid disappointment.

Caddies can be arranged with a minimum of one week's advance notice. In most cases, our caddies are also club members who can provide a wealth of course knowledge as you make your way around the links.

Add to Our History, 130 years and Counting

Goswick's storied history dates back to a Friday evening in October 1889 when several local enthusiasts of the suddenly booming game of golf met at a pub in Berwick-upon-Tweed 'to consider a scheme to organise a golf club and to hear a report as to a piece of ground.'

An initial 9-hole layout opened for play in April 1890 and was then extended to 18 holes in 1894. After surviving the Great War, the club engaged James Braid — whose reputation as a course designer rivalled that of his playing prowess — to lengthen and strengthen the layout. Much of Braid's masterful imprint on Goswick Links remains largely intact to this day.

Another key turning point occurred in the 1960s when Frank Pennink was employed to transform Goswick into a course of championship calibre. This included the creation of two new holes, the present-day par-4 5th and par-5 6th.

Today Goswick is, without a doubt, second to none in Northumberland and one of the top courses throughout England. For evidence of this, look no further than the endorsement of the R&A which selected Goswick as one of 13 regional qualifying sites for the Open Championship across Great Britain and Ireland.

Goswick's storied past is, no doubt, merely the prelude to an even more glorious future. We invite you to add, even if only in a small way, to our ongoing story.


