## DR. HERBERT WIGWE

Dr. Herbert Wigwe, CON is a visionary, a progressive business leader, philanthropist and humanitarian. Acclaimed as one of Africa's foremost corporate bankers, Herbert is the Co-Founder, Group Managing Director (GMD) and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Access Holdings Plc, one of Africa's leading financial institutions. He is also the Founder of the HOW Foundation; a leading social enterprise invested in youth empowerment, education, women empowerment, health, thought leadership and mentorship.

Most recently, he founded Wigwe University, a culmination of his lifelong ambition to build an exceptional, world-class, innovative, yet uniquely African institution to grow the next generation of leaders who will change the face of the African continent.

Dr. Wigwe also served as the Chairman of Access Bank (Ghana), Access Investment & Securities Limited, Central Securities and Clearing System (CSCS) and is the current Chairman of Access Bank (UK) Limited and Unified Payments Services Limited.

He is a Board Member of Nigerian Mortgage Refinance Company and a member of the advisory Board for Friends Africa.

Dr. Wigwe graduated from University of Nigeria, Nsukka and received a B SC. Degree in Accountancy; a Master's degree in Banking and Finance from the University College of North Wales (now Bangor); a Master of Science degree in Financial Economics from the University of London and is an Alumnus of the Harvard Business School Executive Management Programme.

He is a Fellow of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Nigeria, a Fellow of the Institute of Credit Administration, and an Honorary member of the Chartered Institute of Bankers of Nigeria.

#### DR. HIPPOLYTE FOFACK

Dr Hippolyte Fofack is the chief economist and director of research and international cooperation at the African Export-Import Bank, with more than 20 years of experience in development economics, international trade, banking, international finance, and academia.

Previously, he served in several capacities with the World Bank Group, including as head of the Macroeconomics and Growth Program. Fofack is a fellow of the African Academy of Sciences and a member of the American Economic Association and the African Finance and Economic Association. Fofack has published extensively and served as guest editor of the World Bank Economic Review, Economic History of Developing Regions, and Journal of African Trade. He is editor-in-chief of Contemporary Issues in African Trade and Trade Finance and serves on the editorial boards of the Journal of African Development, the Journal of African Trade, and the Gulf Economics Journal. Dr Fofack has taught and given lectures at several universities and research institutions.

He holds a master's degree in economics from the University of Lille, an advanced degree in international economics and finance from the University of Bordeaux, and a Ph.D. from American University in Washington DC.

In addition to his research and regular columns on global affairs published by Project Syndicate, he has also been a regular contributor to many newspapers and magazines, including African Banker, African Business, Al Jazeera, AllAfrica Global Media, Financial Times, The Banker, Guardian, Le Monde, Japan Times, CGTN, and Newsweek.

Ismail is the Founder and Chairman of WorldRemit Group, a global money transfer company.

In October 2020, Ahmed was named first in the <u>Powerlist</u> 2020, an annual list of the 100 most powerful people of African heritage in the UK. The following year, his company launched the Top 10 Most Influential Africans in the Diaspora list, in order to explore and celebrate the contributions of African immigrants to the USA.

He is also the Founder of Sahamiye
Foundation, a non-profit organisation
dedicated to transforming lives in the Horn of
Africa through the promotion of literacy and
education. Before setting up WorldRemit,
Ismail worked for the United Nations
Development Programme, assisting African
money transfer companies in complying with
anti-money laundering regulations.

Ismail holds an MSc and PhD from the University of London, as well as an MBA from the London Business School.

She is the Founder of Ibukun Awosika Leadership Academy, the Convener of The International Woman Leadership Conference in Dubai, and also the Founder of the Christian Missionary Fund, a faith-based organization spread across Nigeria to change lives.

With an undergraduate degree in Chemistry from the University of Ife Nigeria and advanced degrees from various global institutions, including Lagos Business School, IESE Business School, Wharton, and China European International Business School (CEIBS).

She serves as Chairman or Board member on various Corporate and non-profit boards around the world, across Education, Energy, IT, Manufacturing, Retail, Financial Services, Corporate Governance, and Advocacy.

She is a woman of many firsts; she is the first Chairperson of the Nigerian National Advisory Board for Impact Investing, the first Female Chairperson of Nigeria's Premier Bank, First Bank, the first Nigerian recipient of the prestigious International Women Entrepreneurial Challenge (IWEC) Award, and the first African recipient of the International Friendship Award 2019 by the Queen of Spain.

She is committed to serving nations. She was recently appointed to the UK G7 Impact Taskforce and the Global Steering Group for Impact Investing (GSG). She is a member of the

Nigerian Economic Summit Group and served on the pioneer board of the Nigerian Sovereign Wealth Fund.

Her recent recognitions are the 2020 Forbes Woman Africa Chairperson Award; and Beta Gama Signa 2020 Business Achievement Award. She is a fellow of the African Leadership Initiative, Aspen Global Leadership Network, and a recipient of 4 Honorary Doctorate Degrees.

## PROF. WALE ADEBANWI


Wale Adebanwi is Presidential Penn Compact Professor of Africana Studies at the University of Pennsylvania. His research and teaching interests are in the broad area of the social mobilisation of power and interests in Africa as manifested in and/or through ethnicity, nationalism, racial and urban formations, elites, state and civil society, media, intellectual history, and social theory.

Professor Adebanwi received his BSc in Mass Communication from the University of Lagos, Nigeria, MSc in Political Science from the University of Ibadan, Nigeria, Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of Ibadan, and MPhil and Ph.D. in Social Anthropology from the University of Cambridge, UK. His sole-authored monographs include Authority Stealing: Anti-Corruption War and Democratic Politics in Post-Military Nigeria (CAP, 2011), Yorùbá Elites and Ethnic Politics in Nigeria: Obáfémi Awólówò and Corporate Agency (Cambridge, 2014), The Nation as Grand Narrative: The Nigerian Press and the Politics of Meaning (Rochester, 2016).

He is the (co)editor of eight books the most recent of which include Elites and the Politics of Accountability in Africa (Michigan UP, 2021) and Everyday State and Democracy in Africa: Ethnographic Encounters (Ohio UP, 2022). He has been a co-editor of the Journal of Contemporary African Studies and AFRICA: Journal of the International Africa Institute. His scholarly articles have appeared in Theory, Culture and Society, Comparative Studies in Society and History, Journal of Historical Sociology, Ethnic and Racial Studies, Commonwealth and Comparative Politics, Citizenship Studies, Democratization, African Affairs, Journal of Modern African Studies, AFRICA: Journal of the International Africa Institute, and Review of African Political Economy.

Before joining the University of Pennsylvania, he was, at various times, an assistant professor, associate professor, and full professor at the University of Ibadan, Nigeria, University of California, Davis, USA, and University of Oxford, UK. He was the Rhodes Professor of Race Relations until June 2021, Director of the African Studies Center, Oxford (2017-2020) and a Governing Board Fellow at St Antony's College, Oxford. He was a Visiting Professor at Rhodes University, Grahamstown, South Africa and he is currently an Honorary Research Associate at the African Studies Center, Oxford.
