Planning

Establish a District-wide School Emergency Plan



If it is not already in place, a District-wide School Emergency Team should be formed to develop the District-wide School Emergency Plan.






Establish Building-Level Response Plans



Each should include maps, assembly areas, and a list of resources during an Active Threat emergency







Create a safe environment

Ensure that each facility is physically secure:

- An access Control System that's electronic to allow for Lockdown and/or Lockout ability
- A security system equipped with A.I. capabilities for Weapons and Gunshot Detection
- A visitor Management Policy Policies to restrict and control building access.
- An Emergency Alerting and Communication System—able to provide immediate notifications to everyone on-site and the Police; capable of integrating with all Security Systems to automate emergency response protocols and eliminate time and human error





Create a safe environment

Additionally,

- Establish procedures for building access limiting entry points, and securing all other exterior doors
- Conduct a Technical Threat Vulnerability Assessment by a company specializing in security and safety






Establish Direct and Timely

Communications

- O Sound the alarm while simultaneously:
 - Initiating Pre-Recorded PA announcement
 - Communicating directly with 911 Police Dispatch and all Mobile Patrol Vehicles
 - Utilizing all IPTV and Digital Signage to Broadcast Active Threat alert
 - Incorporating alarm lights on the exterior and interior of the building(s) as a visual indication of an Active Threat event







Training and Drills



Training and conducting drills for *all* types and severities of emergency lockdown situations, not just the most likely or the most extreme, can increase success rates and safety if an actual threat occurs.

Be sure students know where to go during an active threat.







Alyssa's Law

What is it?

Alyssa's Law is critical legislation addressing the issue of law enforcement response time when a life-threatening emergency occurs because:

Time=Life.

The law calls for the installation of silent panic alarms that are directly linked to law enforcement, so in case of any emergency they will get on the scene as quickly as possible, take down a threat and triage any victims.


What went wrong?

- O No lockdown called for the Active Threat
- Shooter walked through an open door
- She didn't know where the safe zone was or where to hide





Major school shootings since 2018




10 school shootings occurred even in the midst of the pandemic and left 3 killed and 9 injured*

2018 2019 2020 202

Saugus High School shooting wounded 3 and killed 2* 24 school shootings have occurred leaving 6 people killed and 34 injured*, with more shootings happening every day









Active Threat Alerting & Communications Systems should:

- Provide Immediate On-Site Notification of an Active Threat and where in the facility it is occurring
- Provide Immediate Police Notification of an Active Threat Which school and where in the school by location.
- Automate an Integrated Activation of all Active Threat Response Security Systems
- Establish live, two-way communications between the facility and the Police
- Provides updates that the Active Threat event is still on-going and Shelter-in-Place continues.
- Provides Notification that the Active Threat has been neutralized and that an "ALL CLEAR" by the Police given.







D2PD: A Wholistic Solution

What is it?

Ganz D2PD powered by Go²Blu is an Emergency Alerting and Communications System for Active Shooter/Armed Intruder Incidents.

D2PD utilizes Direct to Police Department Technology and communicates with those in harm's way, and with Law Enforcement in 1/4 of one second.





Inefficient/Ineffective Security Tools



Panic Button Apps

As an emergency communications system or panic button, fumbling with a smartphone in the middle of an active threat could result in deadly consequences.

These are also not wholistic solutions by themselves.



Physical Panic Buttons


Lacking in specific locations, which could mean the difference between life and death.

Quicker Response Time by Police = Greater Preservation of Life.



Premise Server Systems

No direct connection to the police, with no secondary communication channel, and are very costly (\$7,500-\$30,000+).







How does it work?

Schools

For Schools, D2PD is an Emergency Alert and 2-way Communications Hub connecting the school to the police.

Police

For the Police, D2PD is an emergency notification system with **instant** 2-way communications and Emergency Operations Plan support.
